LIVE STOCK MARKETS.

Winnipeg, June 1.—Choice butcher steers were quoted from \$16 to \$18. Good quality female butchers ranged from \$13 to \$15.50. Bulls of good quality changed hands at from \$9 to \$12. Choice stocker steers ranged from \$9 to \$16. Choice veal calves were scarce, prices ranging from \$15 to \$18. A small lot of really good lambs brought \$18 with a few good sheep weighing up at \$13. The hog market was steady with select, fed and watered being sold at \$22.

Chicago.

Chicago, June 1.—Cattle—Heavy beef steers, steady to strong; other weights mostly 15 to 40 cents higher; calves 50 cents to \$1 higher; all other classes steady. Hogs, mostly 15 to 25c lower; top, \$15.10; bulk, light and light butchers, \$14.80 to \$16; bulk, 250 pounds and over, \$14.50 to \$14.90; pigs 25c lower, with bulk at \$12 to \$12.50. BIG CIRCUS IN TOWN TO-MORROW.

Tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock will mark the opening of the tanbark, sawdust and spangles season in Kingston at the regular grounds. For months the sparks circus cohorts have been diligently rehearsing the long program and all is now in readiness. The performance will start off with an entry of wondrous splendor in which all of the performers of this great tented enterprise will trail back their way in stately procession around the hippodrome track. The costumes and all properties are entirely new, and the resources of the circus in horses, elephants, camels, etc. are drawn upon to the fullest extent. After the entry will come the purely circus features and for a matter of over two hours the rings and hippodrome track will be scenes of kaleidoscopic activity. There will be the Sparks Stable of Shimmy and tango dancing horses who actually dance to the music of the band and keep in perfect time, even when the music changes. Madge Evans, the world's greatest lady elephant trainer will be on hand with her many tons of elephants. Then there will be the roller skating and bicycle riding bears and the great Mataka will do his front and backward slides for life on a narrow thread-like wire from the highest point of the tent to the ground, traversing a distance of 150 feet. Of course the usual stunts will be on hand to extract the laughs left over from the last visit of the circus. The Menagerie will be found to be most interesting and one hour's time will be given before the performance starts so that you can see it in its entirety. One can get a very fair idea of the magnitude and calibre of the Sparks Circus from the two mile long, open den street parade at 10.30 a.m. Two performances will be given—at 2 and 8 p.m.
