INCREASE OF \$11,819,018

Customs Duties Compiled for April

Ottawa, June 2 .- An increase of \$11,819,018 in the customs receipts of the dominion for the first two months of the fiscal year, as com-pared with the same period last year, is shown by the customs department returns compiled yesterday. For the two months of April and May, 1919, the customs receipts were \$25,689,-690, while for the same two months this year they totalled \$37,508,708. For the month of May alone the increase amounts to \$5,480,499 as compared with last year. Customs receipts for the month just ended totalled \$19,745,200, while in May last year they amounted to \$14,264,-


