

TY COBB MAY LEAD THE DETROIT TIGERS

The Tigers Badly Disorganized and Shakeup in Management Likely.

A Detroit Despatch says:-Although it is not to be expected that Frank Navin, chief owner of the Detroit Baseball Club, will announce his private business plans in advance to the effect that some drastic changes in the executive department of the Tigers' organization are impending, and impending very closely at that.

The fans admit it, and the fact cannot be disguised in major league society. They have been doing it constantly since the season opened six weeks ago, and, although they played games at home, and have met every team in the league, they have not won a single series. They proved helpless a month after the season opened, when they should have hit their true stride, even against socalled weak teams of the East. One game out of each four played is the best they have been able to accomplish.

Shake-up Promised.

It is inconceivable that a team representing the best baseball city in the circuit should be allowed to flounder along as the Tigers are doing. That is what makes it seem highly probable that a big shake-up on the team will be made very soon. As to what is going to happen, there are many rumors. It is not improbable that there will be some new blood injected into the withering Tiger frame, and that the old blood

will be stirred up considerably. There is one story, from a usually reliable source, that Hugh Jennings will be supplanted as manager b Ty Cobb, and that Jennings will be given the position of Vice-President. This story is based upon the assumption that Jennings has lost his punch as a field manager.

Attention is also being called to the fact that Jack Coombs is making a fizzle of directing the pitching staff, and has lost the confidence and respect of the players. The pitchers are certainly out of whack somewhere, whether it is the fault of Coombs or not. Certainly the men are not going as well this year as they did last, when they had no Coombs.

Coombs Not Popular. Jack is not popular with the players, possibly it is because he preaches too much. It is certain his pull with the players began to wane even be-fore the training season was over.

In view of this situation, it is pos-sible that something might happen to The Tigers have some very good material. Doubtless some players could be used advantageously in deals with other clubs. It may be put down as a certainty that if the

Without doubt, Mr. Navin can be relied upon to make the necessary moves. He has shown an almost infinite patience with his club
