TY COBB MAY LEAD THE DETROIT TIGERS

The Tigers Badly Disorganized and Shake-up in Management Likely.

A Detroit Dispatch says:—Although it is not to be expected that Frank Navin, chief owner of the Detroit Baseball Club, will announce his private business plans in advance of their consummation, there is a well-defined rumor in circulation here, and one which will not do down to the effect that some drastic changes in the executive department of the Tigers' organization are impending, and that they will be made very soon.

Shake-up Promised.

It is inconceivable that a team representing the best baseball city in the circuit should be allowed to founder along as the Tigers are doing. That is what makes it seem highly probable that a big shake-up on the team will be made very soon. As to what is going to happen, there are many rumors. It is not improbable that there will be some new blood injected into the withering Tiger frame, and that the old blood will be stirred up considerably.

Lipton's Challenger upsets Calculations.

Sir Thomas Lipton's Shamrock IV, challenger for America's Cup, this week upset calculations of critics who have been predicting that she would be sluggish and would need a stiff breeze to keep her in motion. The yacht gave an impression display in Long Island Sound of what may be expected should light weather prevail in any of the international contests.

Statistics for the recent Toronto Woodbine meeting show Irish Kiss to be the winning horse, Harry Giddings the leading rider. Irish Kiss won \$8,835 with one winner and one second, while St. Paul, the King's Plate winner, won two races for a total of \$7,625. Rodriguez had ten winning mounts, seven seconds and five thirds, and was unplaced thirteen times. J. Hupepel was second, tied with R. Romanelli, with five winning mounts. In eleven races J. Butwell was only unplaced twice, while Claver was only unplaced once in eleven starts. Harry Giddings, Jr., saddled six winners, leading the trainers.

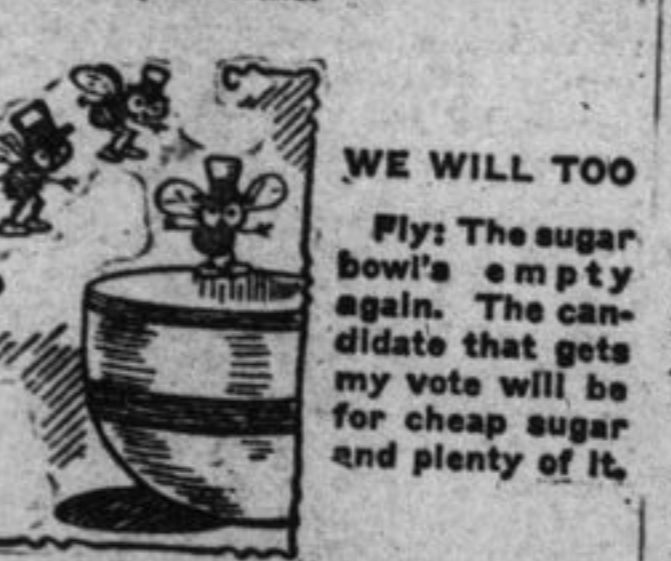
