Vancouver, B.C., June 5 .- Former Premier Paul Painleve, of France, arrived here yesterday, en route to China, "The object of my mission," he said, "is to bring China and France closer together. We will act as technical and intellectual guides for the Chinese, and in turn we will take back some of China's culture." He is accompanied by prominent French educational and technical reresentatives.
