Small Cars to Race.

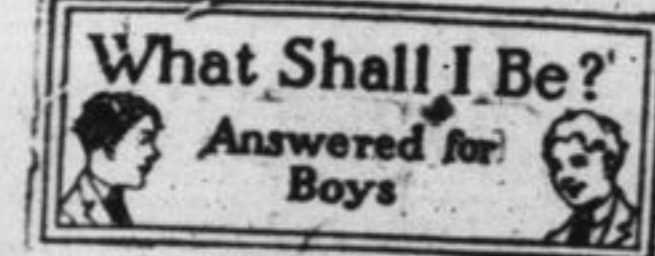

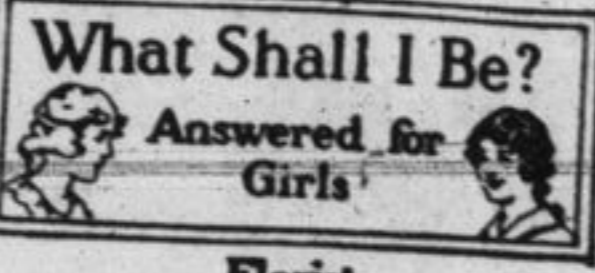

Because of the perishable nature of the goods, a large margin is needed to replace any loss that may arise. Girls and women will make a success at this kind of work, if they know enough about plant growing, show perseverance, and possess executive ability.
