SEAL ED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned and endorsed “Tender for dredging Port Hope, Ont.” etc., as the case may be, will be received until 12 o'clock a. m. Tuesday, June 29, 1920, for the dredging required at Port Hope, Ont., Cobourg, Ont., Whitby, Ont., Bowmanville, Ont., Oakville, Ont., and Kingston, Ont.

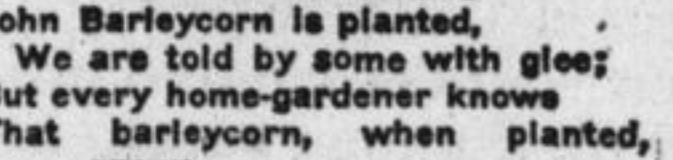
