Unparalleled Purses For Canadian-Breds

The progress of racing in Canada this season has an illustration in the liberal amounts offered for purses at the Fort Erie meeting, which opens on Saturday, especially with regard to the provision for Canadian-bred horses.

The minimum amount offered in the daily race for the productions of Canadian breeding establishments is \$1,200, which a few years ago would be a fair size amount for an open race; and only a few are for the minimum amount, some running to \$2,000 for an overnight event, an unprecedented figure, and one that Canadian breeders would not have dreamed of a few seasons back. Altogether the Fort Erie program calls for an average distribution of about \$11,000 a day.

Fulton to Meet Wills

Heavyweight Fred Fulton and Harry Wills will meet in the first bout of importance under the new law permitting boxing contests in New York. This announcement is made here by the International Sports Club, which has matched the pugilists for a 15-round contest. The date will be made public later. Under the terms of agreement Fulton is to receive \$25,000 and Wills \$10,000, without any percentage or bonus arrangement. While no definite date has been announced, it is understood the contest will be held about the middle of July. It is intimated that the winner will be given an opportunity to face Champion Jack Dempsey later in the year.

Home Runs Featured Ball Game
