#### RUTH IS DRIVING TOWARDS BATTING CHAMPIONSHIP

With a new world's record within his grasp, "Babe Ruth, the New York slugger, is driving towards the batting championship of the American League.

Reposing in fourth place a week ago, the home-run king is now second in the list of batters, with an average of .386-thirty-three points behind George Sisler, the St. Louis star, who is leading the league. Ruth passed the veteran Tris Speaker, of Cleveland, and Joe Jackson, of Chicago, who are tied for the third place honors with .385. Sisler, in first place, is batting .419.


