## World of Sport

### RUTH IS DRIVING TOWARDS BATTING CHAMPIONSHIP

With a new world's record within his grasp, "Babe Ruth, the New York slugger, is driving towards the batting championship of the American League.

Reposing in fourth place a week ago, the home-run king is now second in the list of batters, with an average of .336—thirty-three points behind George Sisler, the St. Louis star, who is leading the league. Ruth passed the veteran Tris Speaker, of Cleveland, and Joe Jackson, of Chicago, who are tied for the third place honors with .385. Sisler, in first place, is batting .419.

Although Ruth failed to fatten his home-run record during the week, he connected with thirteen hits in nine games. In addition, he pulled away from Speaker for scoring honors. He has crossed the plate seventy times, while the Clevelander is two runs behind him.

Rice, of Washington, continues to burn the paths and is far out in front among the base-stealers with thirty-five thefts. Other leading batters: Weaver, Chicago, .365; Rice, Washington, .357; Milan, Washington, .346; E. Collins, Chicago, .340; Hendryx, Boston, .338; Felsch, Chicago, .333.

Evers, of Boston, pitcher, outfielder and pinch-hitter, dethroned Rogers Hornsby as leader among the National League batters who have participated in forty or more games. He is batting .403 for 47 games, in which he cracked out 29 hits in 72 times at bat. Hornsby, however, is the real leader among the regulars with a mark of .378, made in 73 games. Hollocher, of Chicago, had tied the St. Louis star as a run-getter, having crossed the plate fifty times. Cy Williams, of Philadelphia, delivered his weekly home run and is leading in circuit drives with nine. Max Carey, the Pittsburgh outfielder, stole three more bases and is far in front of the base-stealers with 23 thefts.

Since joining the Brooklyn team Pitcher Rube Marquard has defeated his former teammates, the Giants, 11 times in 14 starts. Tim Hendryx, former Louisville slugger, is upholding his reputation as a hitter by leading the Red Sox in batting.
