White dimity, checked in coral, red or blue, is a happy choice for a dress worn by a girl from 9 to 15 or even older.

Gingham checked in blue, lavender, green, pink or rose is especially effective when trimmed with white pique or madras. Organdie also trims these little dresses and is more effective on dimity than the heavier white material.

The dress illustrated on the left is white dimity checked with coral. The vest of white organdie, the collar and cuffs, are Windsor—stitched in coral wool. Pearl buttons trim the centre of the vest. The broad sash may be organdie or it may be made of the dimity cut on the bias. The skirt is cut in sections into which are set ruffles of organdie.

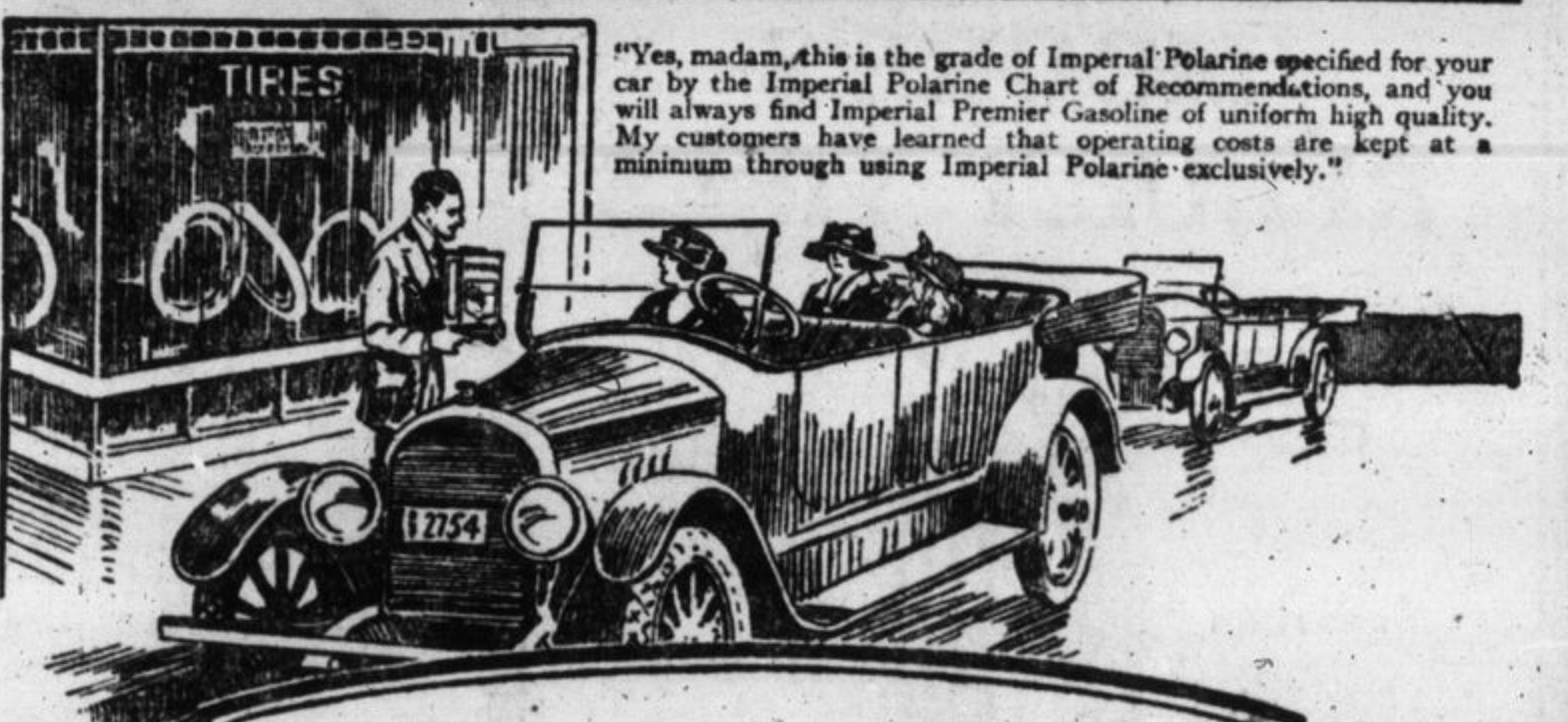
