> FEWER CATTLE TUBERCULAR British Columbia Reduced Disease

From Eighty Per Cent. Vancouver, B.C., Aug. 4 .- "Ten years ago eighty per cent, of the cat tle in British Columbia were infected with tuberculosis; last year only two and a half and three per cent. were infected, and within a comparatively short time the number will be nil," W. W. Alton, of Cartier, provincial government veterinarian, states. This year four per cent, of the cattle inspected were ordered destroyed, but this is not an indication that tuberculosis is gaining ground again, as the whole province has not been inspected yet, and the disease is more prevalent in some districts than in

others, Dr. Alton said. Best Hay Crop In Years Is Being


