#### Cobourg Bonds Sold.

Cobourg, has sold a bond issue of \$75,000 to Wood, Gundy & Co., Toronto, for 94.77, being approximately a 6.72 per cent, basis. The bonds are in two blocks of \$50,000 of 20 instalments, and \$25,000 of 15 instalments, at best 6 per cent. Other bids received were those of the United Financial Corporation, 94.53, and of A. E. Ames and Co., 94.09.
