Wheat. Manitoba wheat is from \$3.08 to \$3.15, according to grade, and Ontario wheat is quoted by the Board of Trade at \$2 to \$2.01 for No. 1 winter, \$1.98 to \$2.01 for No. 2, and \$1.92 to \$1.93 for No. 3. No. 1 spring, \$2.02 to \$2.03; No. 2, \$1.98 to \$2.01; No. 3, \$1.95 to \$2.01. All Ontario quotations are f.o.b. shipping points.

Oats. Ontario oats were nominal, and malting barley was quoted at \$1.84 to \$1.86. No. 3, rye was \$2.20 to \$2.25; bran, \$52 per ton; shorts, \$61 per ton, and feed flour, \$3.75 to \$4 per cwt.

Hay. Loose hay on the street was quoted at \$37 to \$39 nominal for No. 1, and \$33 to \$34 for No. 2. Board of Trade quotation, for baled No. 1, was \$31, mixed \$27, and straw in car lots on track \$15 to \$18 per ton. Choice straw, banded, was priced on the street at \$18 to \$20 per ton.

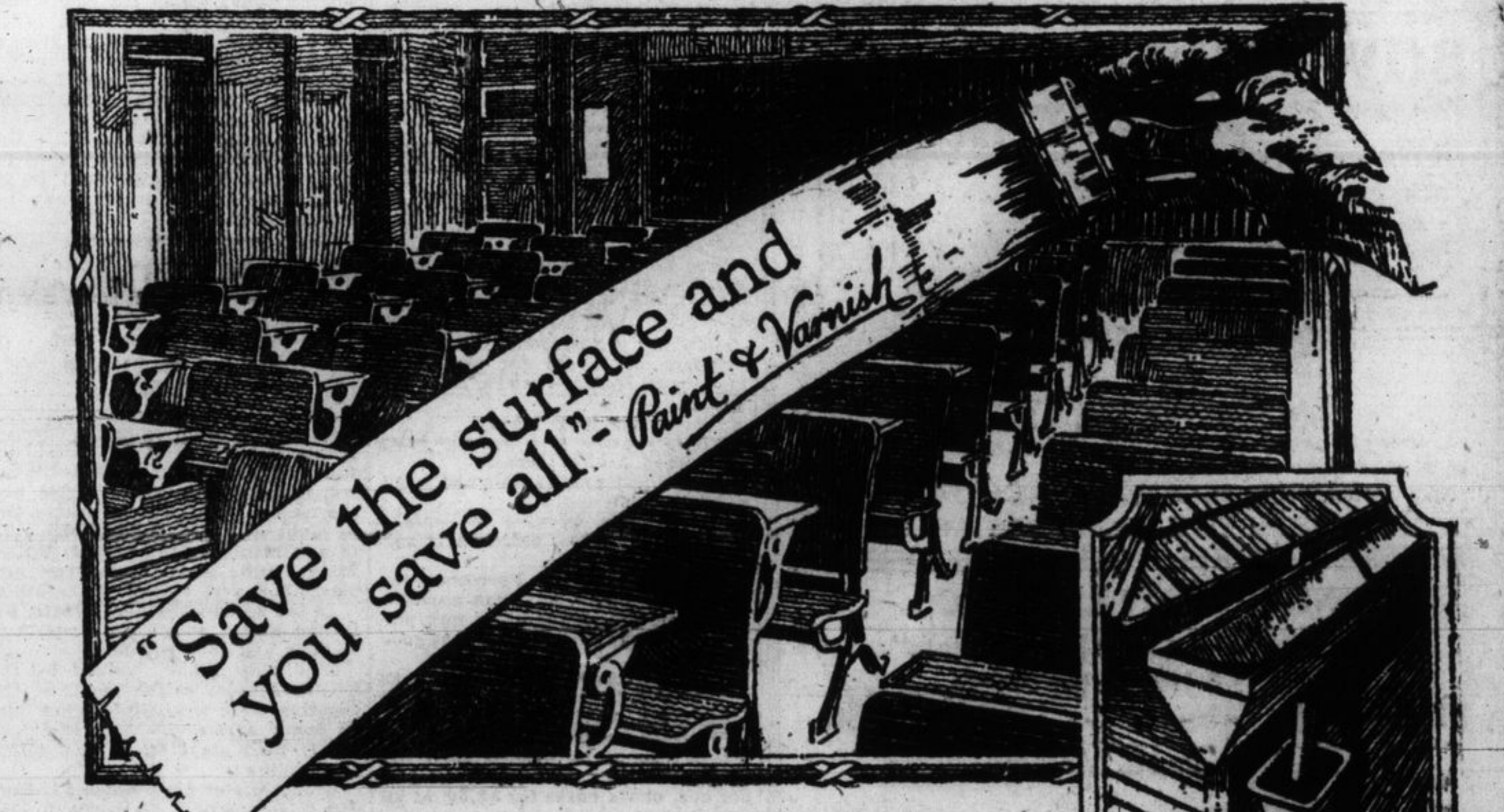
