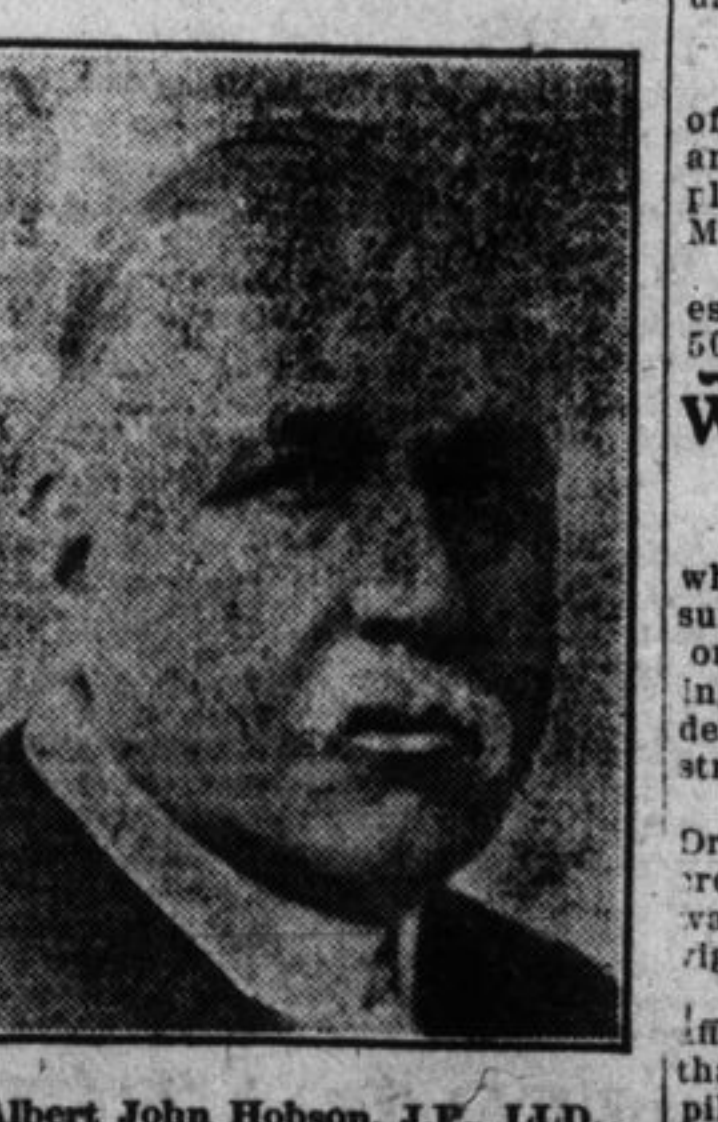
Safeguarding Their Gold.

Albert John Hobson is the vice-chairman of the British Imperial Council of Commerce, and one of the original members of the Sheffield committee on munitions of war, of which he has made chairman in 1916. He is one of the greatest authorities on metals and alloys, and is an ex-master cutter. He was lord mayor of Sheffield 1911-1912. Mr. Hobson was a member of the committee to enquire into financial risks and stock situations of the ministry of reconstruction in England.

SCOTCHMEN STRIKE OVER HIGH RENTS
A One-Day Strike in Big Cities Against Increases by Landlords.

London, Aug. 25.—More than 300,000 workers in Scotland took part Monday in a one-day strike as a protest against higher rents and passed resolutions pledging their refusal to pay the increases. A demand for further action was also made.

In Glasgow alone 60,000 people stayed away from work to attend the demonstrations, and the Clyde shipyards, the engineering shops and other large establishments in the surrounding industrial districts were closed. Car services were suspended generally. However, the movement is reported to have fallen far short of the organizers' hopes and in most places there appeared little enthusiasm.
