Washington, Aug. 31.—Germany is dumping its surplus of inferior goods into Great Britain and United States, and is marking its exports to Great Britain "made in America," and its exports to United States, "Made in England," official advices received here to-day state. German exporters are following this practice, advices said in an effort to regain their former f. reign tado and to realize quickly large sums on manufactured articles which otherwise might not be sold because of popular prejudice.
