


Project is Abandoned.

The International Paper company will not carry out its plans to perfect a pulpwood terminal at Cape Vincent, N.Y., this season. Owing to the shortage of material and building difficulties little has been accomplished in the work begun there. Last spring the company purchased the old terminal property owned by B. L. Taylor and others and announced that a wood handling terminal would be built. Large conveyors for unloading boats and for placing the wood on freight cars were to be built. Sufficient storage would be provided to permit accumulation of wood in summer, during the season of navigation, to last through the winter period.


