The largest baseball park in the world will be built in New York for the New York Americans. Col. Jacob Ruppert of the Yankees, who attended a special meeting of the American League in Philadelphia where the proposal was given official sanction, would not indicate where the park would be located, but said three sites were un-

der consideration. Tentative plans call for grandstands and bleachers capable of seating from 50,000 to 60,000 persons, it was said:

Under the terms of a lease, the Yankees may continue playing at the Polo Grounds-the home of the Giants-but it was said that work on the new park would be pushed so it would be ready for the 1921 season. All the sites under consideration, it was said, are within a few minutes ride from the centre of the city.
