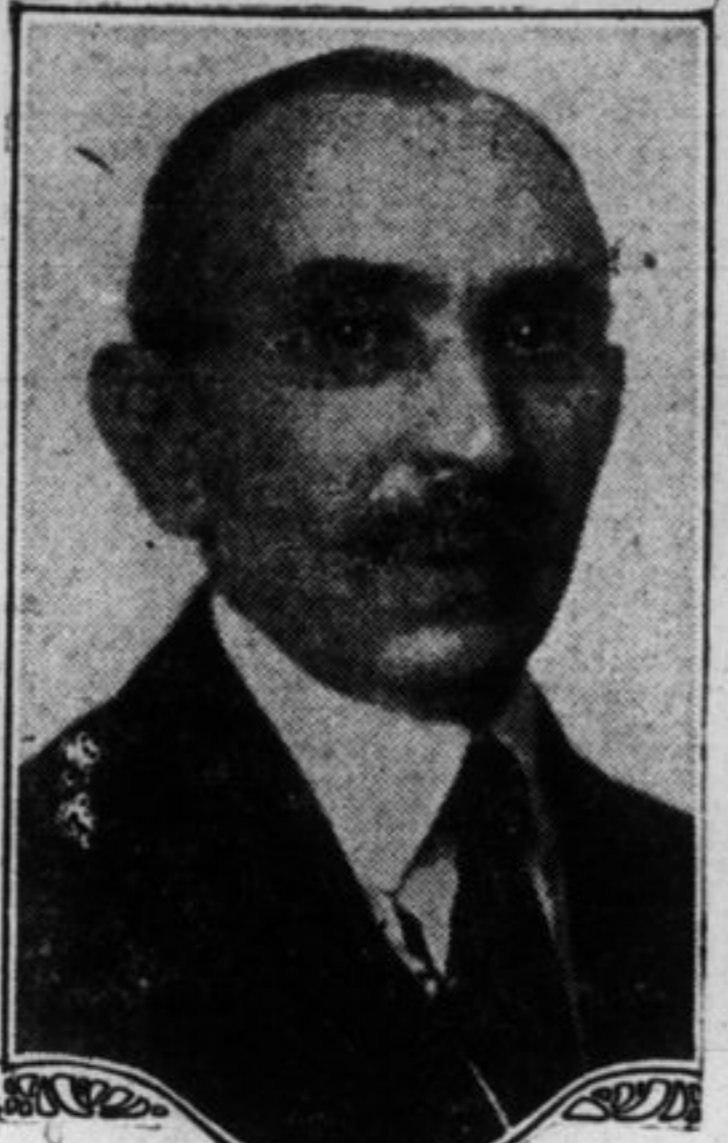
WOLFE ISLAND BARN HIT BY LIGHTNING
