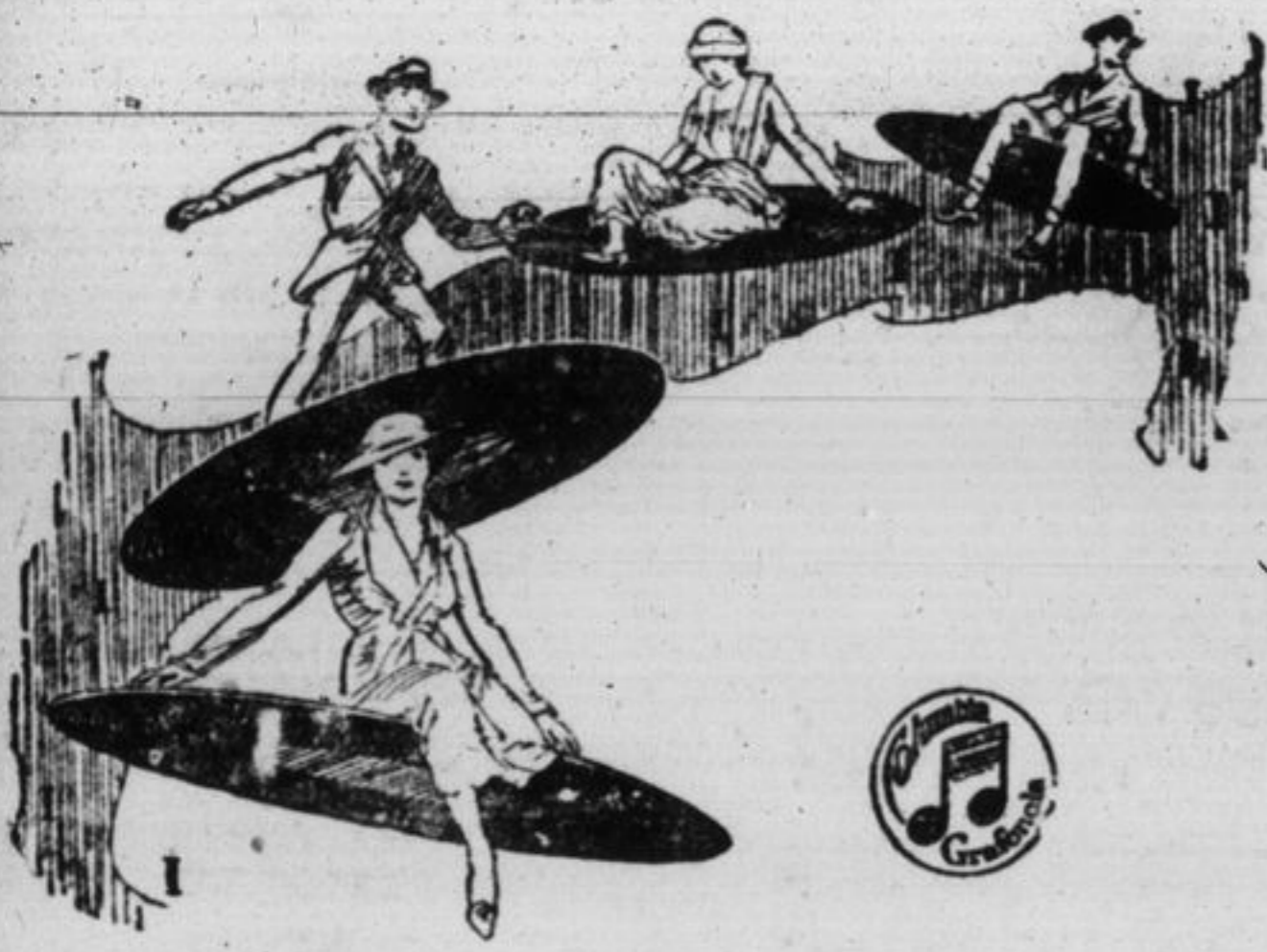

### NEW BOXING RULES FOR U.S. COLLEGES

A set of rules to govern boxing in the United States colleges has just been drafted by a special committee appointed by the National Collegiate Athletic Association. In October there will be a meeting of representatives of all the colleges throughout the country, when a governing league will be organized. A board will probably be selected that will have charge of appointing referees and judges, as in football.

The rules that will govern college boxing are mostly along the lines that governed the sport at the war camps. One of the innovations, however, will be to have the referee outside the ring, as in England. There will be two judges. Each bout will be three rounds of two minutes' duration. A fourth round may be ordered in event of a disagreement.

One of the features of the rules will be that the battlers will wear 10-ounce gloves, the so-called pillows, so as to prevent injuring each other. Only soft bandages may be worn. College boys will act as seconds. No rooting or coaching will be allowed during the rounds.

No boy will be allowed to box another over four pounds heavier than himself. This will prevent an ambitious boxer from winning more than one title.

A maximum of twenty points has been allotted to each round of a contest. It is stipulated that this maximum shall not be exceeded in any case, for in the ordinary course of events if one boxer leads by a greater number of points, than this it means that the contest is one-sided and should be stopped.

The U.S. college boxing rules show that the trend of boxing is toward sportsmanlike competition and with the students taking such general interest in the sport it will also tend to elevate the sport in the professional ranks.

### SOUTH AMERICAN RING CHAMPION TO VISIT U.S.

Luis A. Firpo, South American heavyweight boxing champion, is soon to visit the United States, where he will seek the advantages to be derived from good trainers and expert management. Firpo weighs 213 pounds.

His title was gained by defeating boxers in Chile and other South American countries. In a match in Buenos Aires he knocked out Antonio Jirsa, the Czech-Slovak champion, in the first three-minute round of a scheduled 10-round bout. Firpo has a considerable ring experience.

### SLIM SALLEE RETURNS TO NEW YORK GIANTS

Slim Sallee is back with the Giants. The veteran southpaw, who was traded to the Reds in the winter of 1919 after announcing that he was through with baseball for all time, rejoined the McGrawmen in Boston yesterday.

The Cincinnati club asked for waivers on the tall left-hander ten days ago, and Manager McGraw welcomed the opportunity to add the pitcher to his staff. The injury to Rube Benton in last Sunday's game, at the Polo grounds made the addition of another southpaw necessary. Benton had a gash cut in his hand between two fingers and will be out of the game for a week or ten days.

Sallee was one of Manager Moran's most dependable boxmen in the Reds' victorious dash to the championship last season, but with the passage of the rule forbidding the use of resin on the ball the southpaw's effectiveness was greatly reduced and he failed to turn in his usual number of victories this year. Sallee came to the Giants on July 23, 1916, from St. Louis, where he began pitching in 1908. The Giants traded him to the Reds on March 8th, 1919.

### USE GOVERNMENT HOUSE GROUNDS FOR FOOTBALL

The Ottawa Football Club will get its squad down to practice at once. Secretary Charlie Snelling announced yesterday that arrangements had been made for the use of the Rideau grounds. A deputation representing the Ottawa club waited recently on Lord Richard Neville, comptroller of Government House, and made the request that Ottawa be allowed to use the Rideau Hall grounds until after the Central Canada Exhibition. Permission was granted.

The executive of the Ottawa club held a meeting this week and organized their committee. Major Fred Burpee and Tom Clancy constitute the advertising board, while the finances will again be looked after by President George Church and Secretary-Treasurer Charlie Snelling. The question of a coach has not yet been decided, but the names of "Eddie" Gerrard, "Dave" McCann and "Silver" Quilty are again being linked with the position, in connection with which "Tom" Clancy may also assist.

### U. OF T.'S FIRST WORKOUT ON TUESDAY, SEPT. 14TH.

Coach "Laddie" Cassels is determined that in the matter of early practice he will get his team away in at least a fifty-fifty break with the McGill champions. The first workout of the U. of Toronto gladiators, seniors, intermediates and juniors, has been called for Tuesday, September 14th, one day ahead of McGill, unless the wily "Shag" changes his plans. The blue and white will be minus several of its star players, but there is good material among the intermediates, and Coach Cassels believes that the team will make them all hustle. Breen, the clever backfield player, will return, and it is also thought that Frank Sullivan will do likewise.

### THE KIND OF THING THAT HURTS BOXING

The New York Evening Sun says: "Promoters in Boston are planning to stage a bout between Jack Dempsey and the venerable Gunboat Smith late this month. When this pair met at Buffalo Dempsey polished Smith off in short order. Since then the Gunner has been going steadily downhill. Last Monday the novice, Bob Roper, handed him a severe beating in a twelve-round affair at Fort Worth.

"Whether the fans of Boston will turn out in paying numbers to see him wallowed is doubtful. In any case, it is evident that Boston is badly in need of a boxing commission to prevent such affairs."

**Rugby Notes.** Hamilton Tigers will get down to practice in earnest to-day. To date the senior players have been indulging in only the lightest of work.

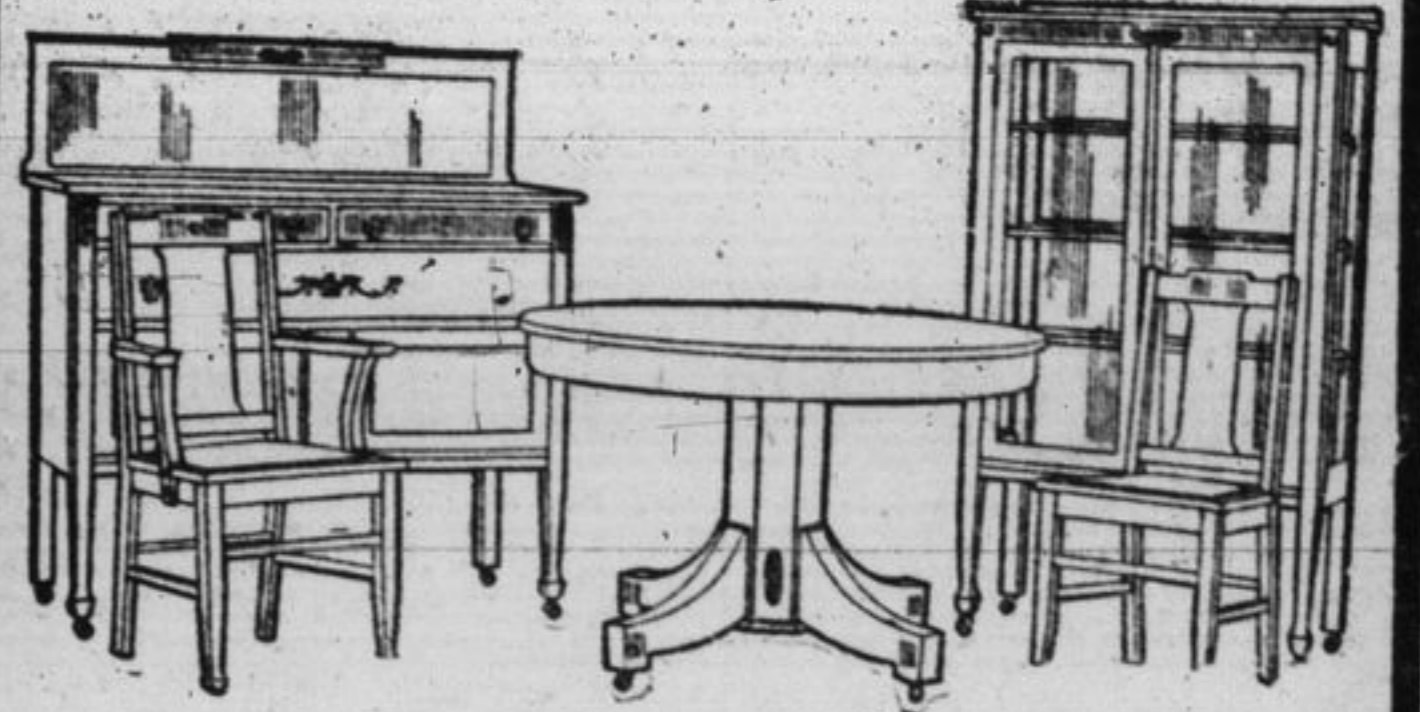

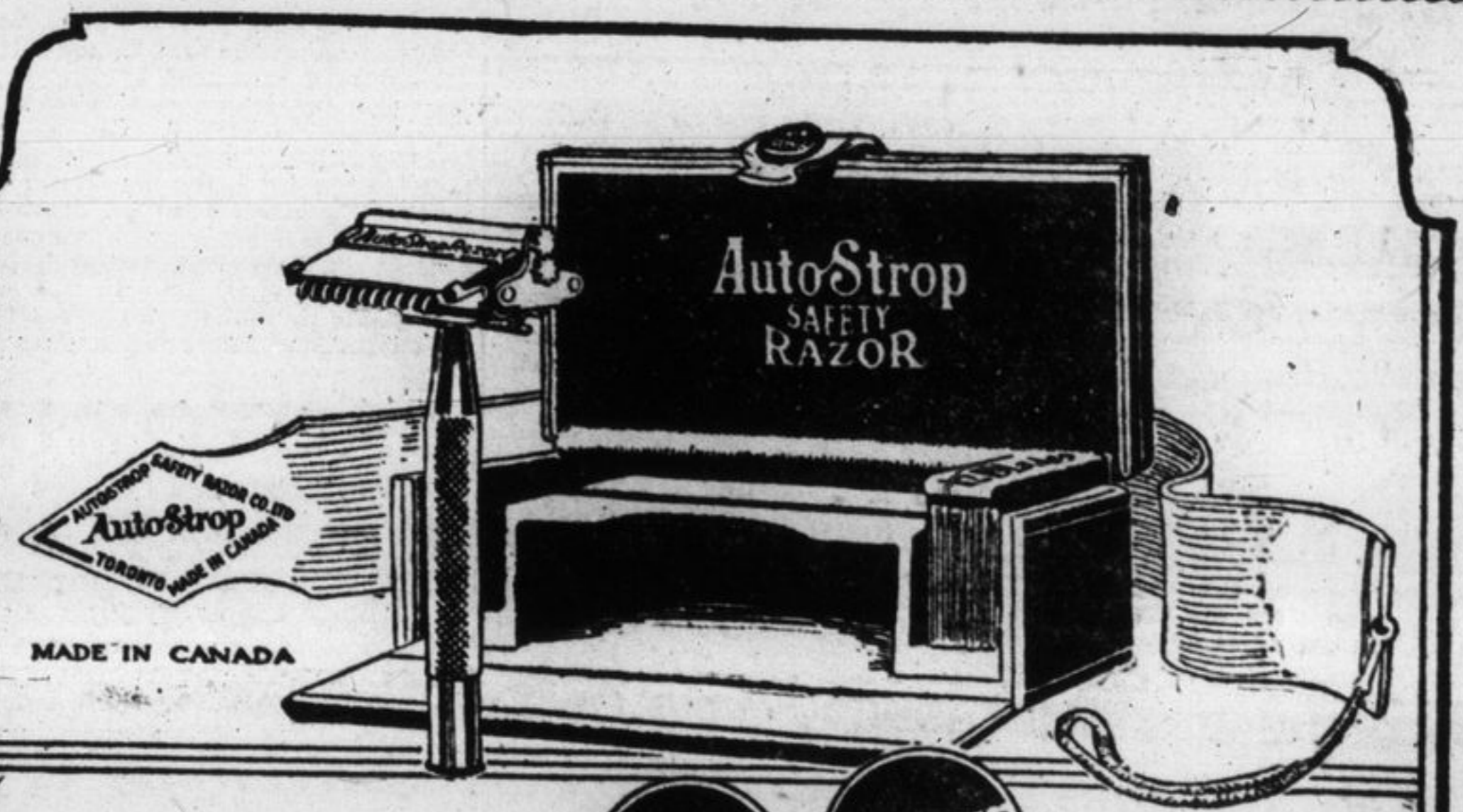
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
