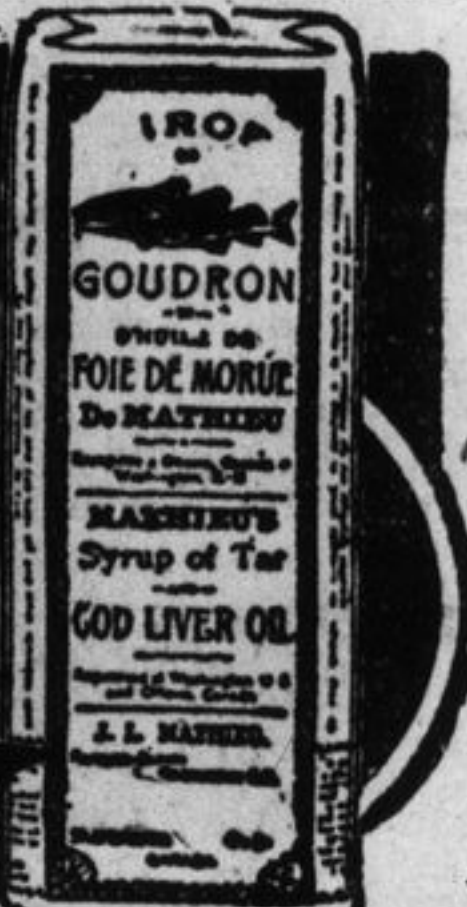

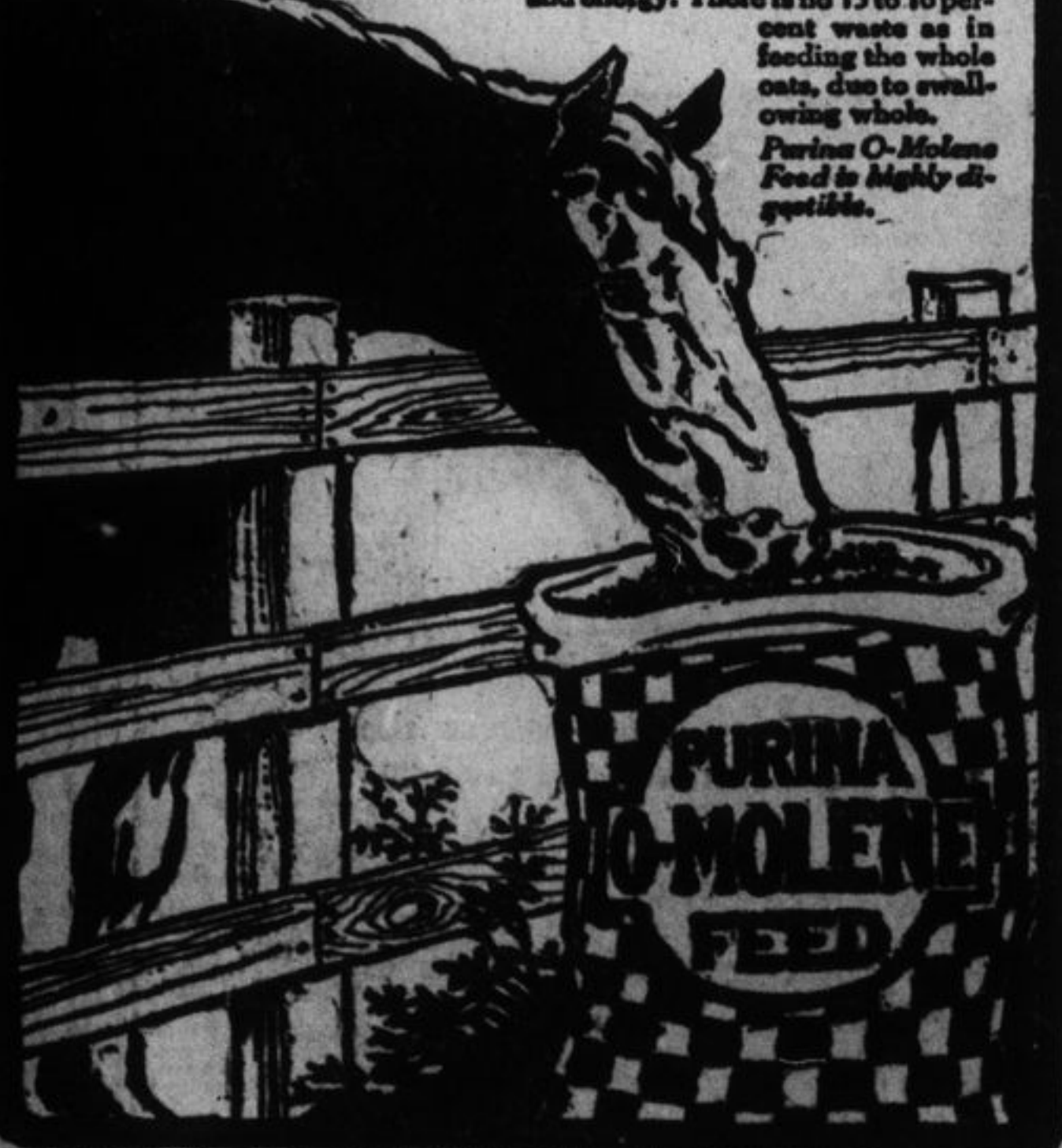

### RUGBY NOTES

Toronto Rugby and Athletic Club will open the football season with an exhibition game in Hamilton on Saturday, October 2. Ottawa and McGill may come together before the close of the regular season.

### BANNER YEAR FOR O.R.F.U.

Junior Series Especially Is Attracting Many New Entries.

Secretary Harry McKee, of the O. R. F. U., announced yesterday that the indications all point to a banner season for the pioneer rugby organization in Canada. The entries that have already been received show that the intermediate and junior series will provide plenty of competition. In all probability the senior series will be composed of the new Toronto Rugby Club and the Parkdale Canoe Club, who are making an appearance in the highest class after several years' absence. These two teams will play a double schedule of four games and they will probably open the season on Oct. 2nd.

Speaking of the senior series of the O.R.F.U. it is to be regretted that there are not more than two teams in the series as the work done by this organization has done more to put Rugby on its present firm footing than that of any others. True, the Intercollegiate encourages the game for collegians, but the scope of this "Union" activity is not wide as that of the Ontario Union. The Interprovincial, commonly known as the Big Four, is merely what the latter name signifies. Very little interest is displayed in bringing on the youngsters and the clubs, at least those at the end of the Union, are fairly well content to let the O.R.F.U. tutor the youngsters and then step in and take them for the Big Four.

This year an effort has been made to make an intermediate series in the Interprovincial, but at present it looks somewhat like a fiver. Dundas and Excelsiors were invited to join in order to make the series more than a home-and-homeseries between the Tiger and Argos second teams, but the Dundas boys are determined to stay by their old love.

### BABE RUTH STANDS TO MAKE \$80,000.

It develops that Babe Ruth, the greatest batsman of them all, is in a fair way to clean up a fortune in this baseball season of 1920 through his changing it to glucose. All of which makes him the best paid baseball player to date for any one season's efforts. Best of all, there is not a fan or player who begrudges the popular star one cent of his great income.

### BABE RUTH LOSES

Application For Permanent Injunction Denied by Judge.

Supreme Court Justice Guy denied the application of George H. Ruth, better known as "Babe" Ruth, star of the New York American League baseball team, for a permanent injunction restraining the Educational Film Corporation and others from displaying the moving picture entitled "Babe Ruth, how he makes his home runs."

Justice Guy cites a decision in the case of Mrs. Grace Humiston versus the Universal Film Manufacturing Company, in which that body ruled that the use of a person's picture as a matter of current news could not be restrained.

Justice Guy does not prejudice the suit for \$1,000,000 which Ruth has brought against the film company.

### INDIAN PITCHER BOUGHT BY PITTSBURG PIRATES.

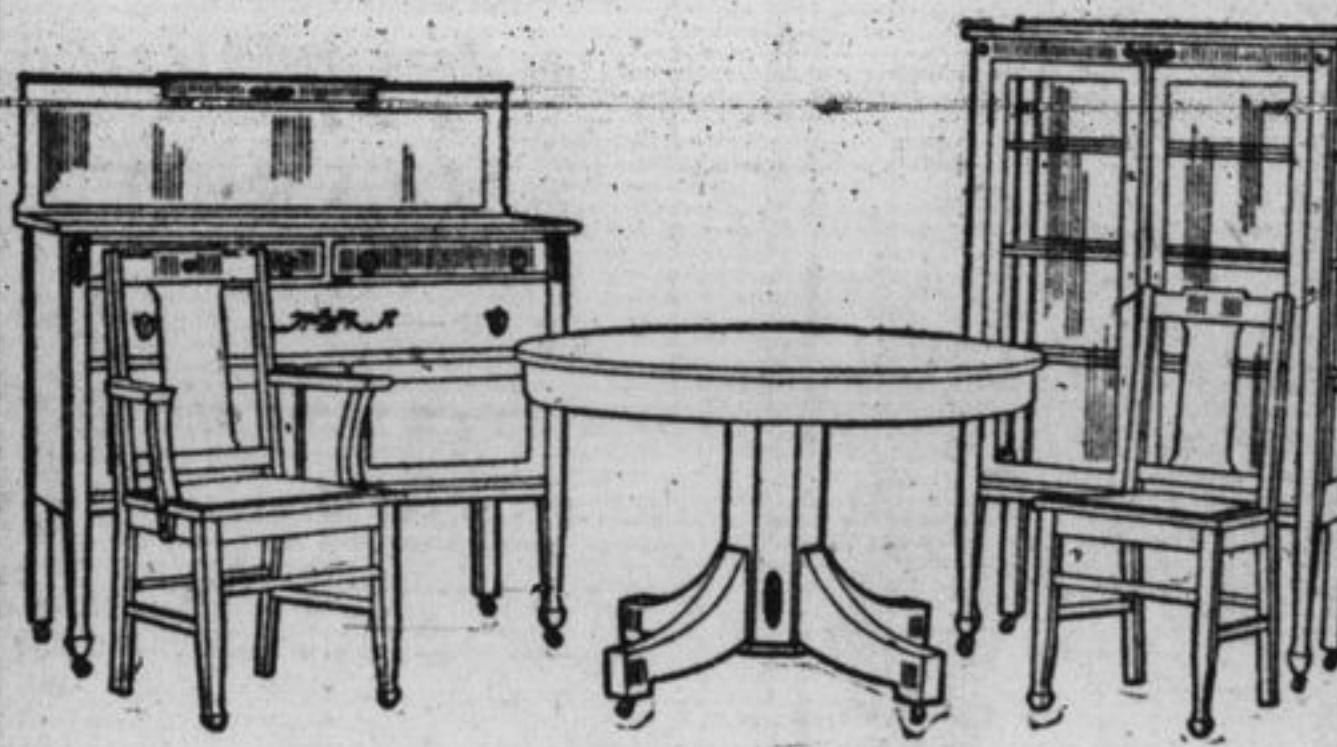

There was a meeting of the branch last night and preliminary plans were made. The team will leave Canada on December 30th on an all-Canadian team by an all-Canadian route. There will be thirty-two in all. Ten from Manitoba, ten from Ontario, six from Nova Scotia, and six from the Canadian branch which has its headquarters in Montreal.

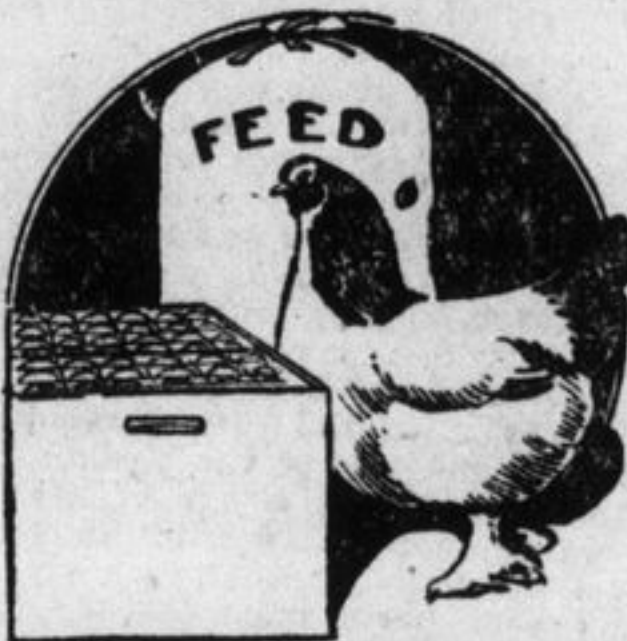

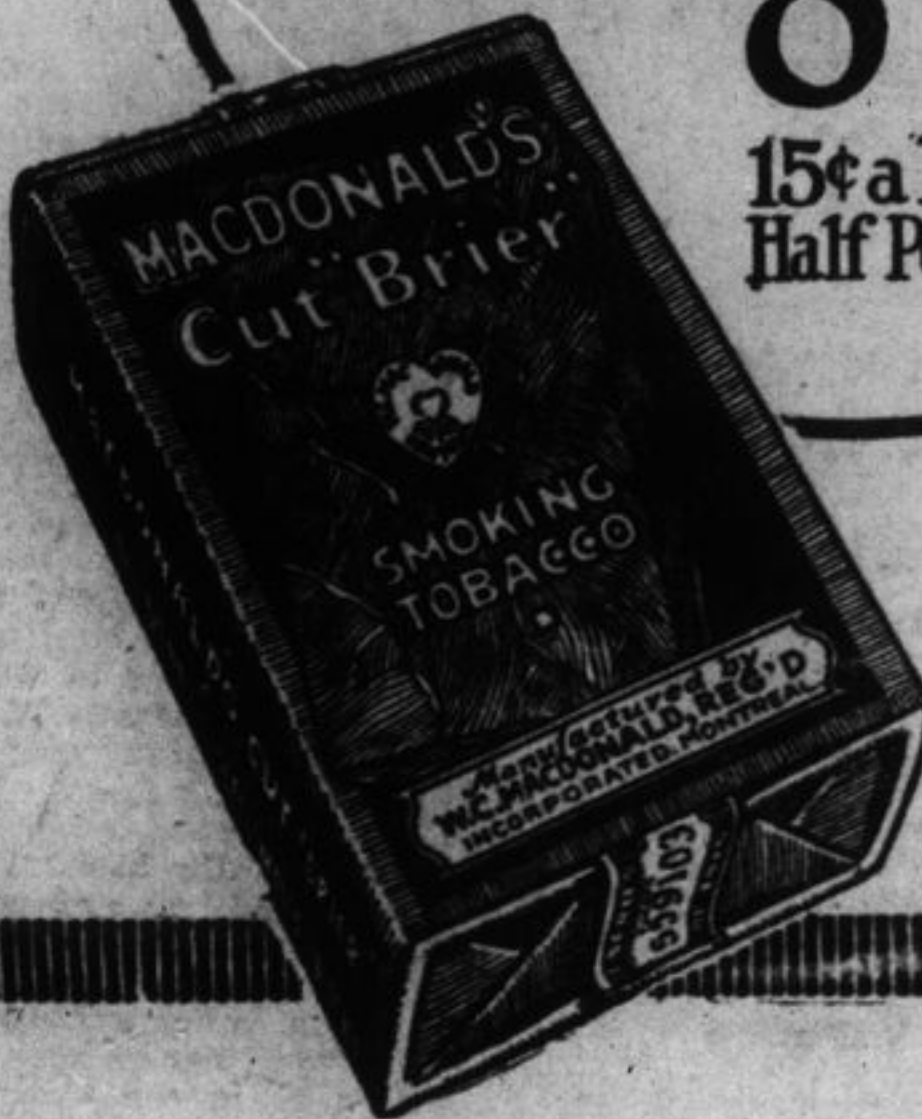
