Montreal.
Montreal, Sept. 23.—Packers' buyers of cattle were not showing any interest. A few sales were made to local butchers at around \$7 for light heifers in fair flesh and medium quality cows. The top for good cows was \$9. A load of heifers and steers were sold to be shipped at \$9.50. Bulls were strong at \$9 to \$9.75.
Good veal, \$12 to \$15; medium, \$10 to \$13; grass, \$6 to \$7.50. One buyer purchased 300 lambs at \$13. Good lambs were most commonly quoted at \$12.50; common \$10 to \$11.50. A few hogs on account of former contracts were weighed up at \$21 and \$20.50 was paid for good lots and \$19 to \$20 for mixed lots from the east.

Winnipeg, Sept. 23.—Trading was slow on the cattle market this morning, especially for anything of good quality. The bulk of sales consisted of common to medium grades, with prices in line with Saturday's close. Butcher steers, medium quality, \$6.50 to \$7.75; female butchers, fair to good, \$6 to \$8; good heavy feeders, \$8 to \$9. The sheep and lamb market was quiet at unchanged quotations. Good lambs ranged from \$11.50 to \$12.50.
