R.C.H.A. OFFICERS' POSTS

Capt. Finney to R.M.C. and Lieut. Hird, R.C.H.A. Riding Instructor.
Two appointments which will be of interest to many Kingstonsians, have been announced by divisional headquarters. The appointments are: Captain W. J. Finney, to the staff of the Royal Military College as instructor in artillery, and Lieut. Hird as riding instructor for the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery.
Both these officers served with the R. C. H. A. for years, and upon the declaration of war volunteered for service, and immediately proceeded overseas, where they won their commissions while fighting in France.
Captain Finney was battery sergeant-major of "B" Battery in 1914, and proceeded overseas with that unit. In 1916 in recognition of his services he was granted a commission and posted to the Reserve Artillery in England, and in 1917 he commanded the Canadian School of Artillery in France. He was later promoted to the staff of the Second Divisional Artillery, a position which he held until demobilization. Upon returning to Canada, Captain Finney was posted to the Royal Military College as instructor in artillery. For his services overseas he was awarded the O. B. E.
Lieut. Hird, who is the new riding master of the R. C. H. A., like Capt. Finney, served in the ranks of that unit. For his services in France he was granted the commissioned rank. His record in France was such that he was granted the M.C. He was three times wounded. Before coming to Canada, Lieut. Hird served with the British army and took a "rough riding" course in India.

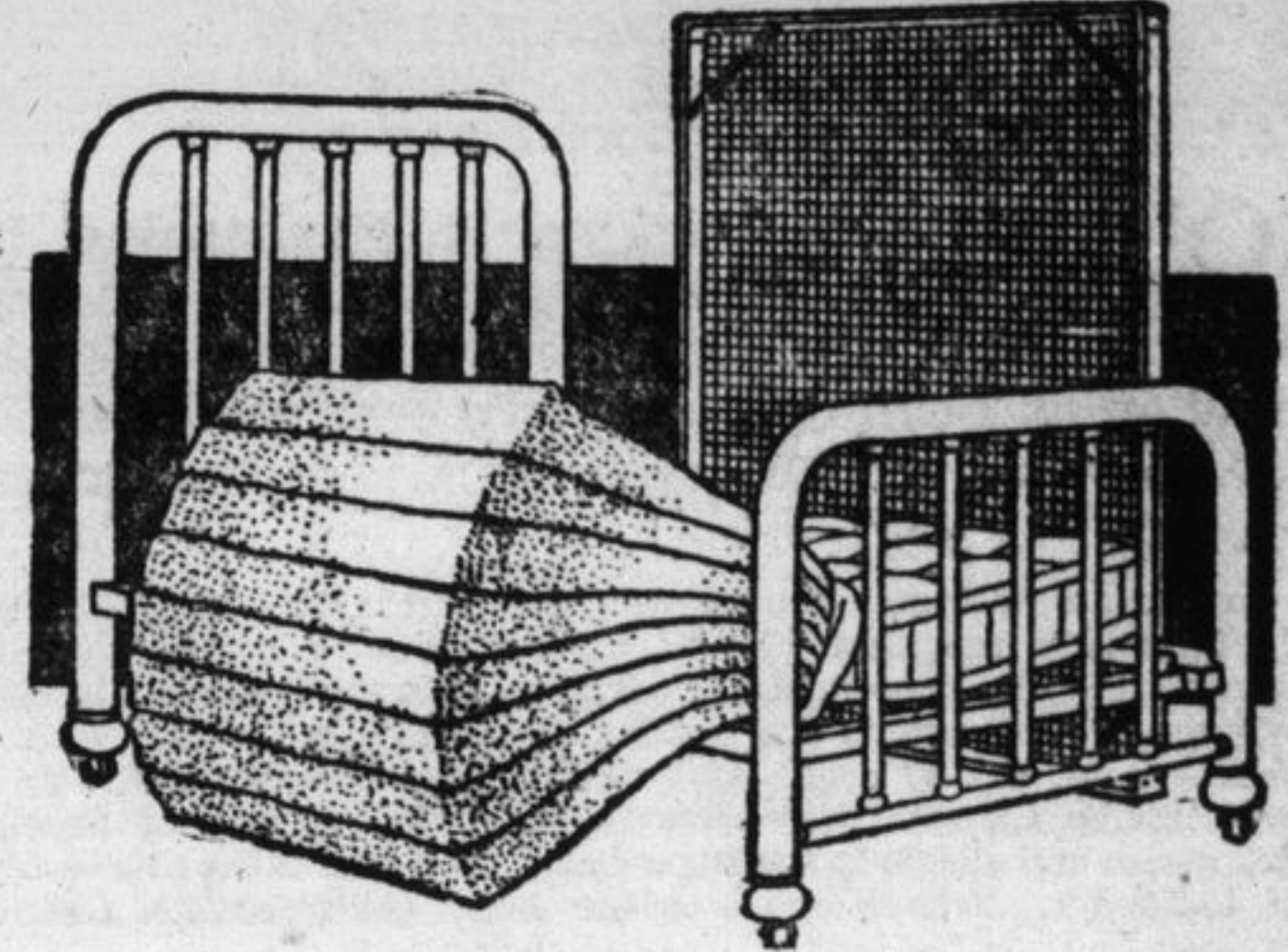
