BLOWOUT PATCH IS DANGEROUS Only an Emergency Measure—Common Mistake to Keep Attached.

Using a blow-out patch for too long a period is a common mistake and a costly one to motorists. A blow-out patch should be used only as a roadside emergency.

Carburetor Leaks. If there is a constant dripping of gasoline from the carburetor, the float valve mechanism is not operating as it should.

To Prevent Short Circuits. There is frequently danger of short circuits in the battery because of the fact that one of the terminals is located near the metal handle used for lifting the battery.

Training a Wire Wheel. In training a slightly misaligned wire wheel a close fitting wrench or parallel pliers should be used on the nipples, and the operation should be performed slowly and evenly.

Loose Rivets. Few owners examine the frame for loose rivets, yet these often shake loose and fall out. A car owner recently found that two rivets which had held a cross member of the frame in place had slipped out.

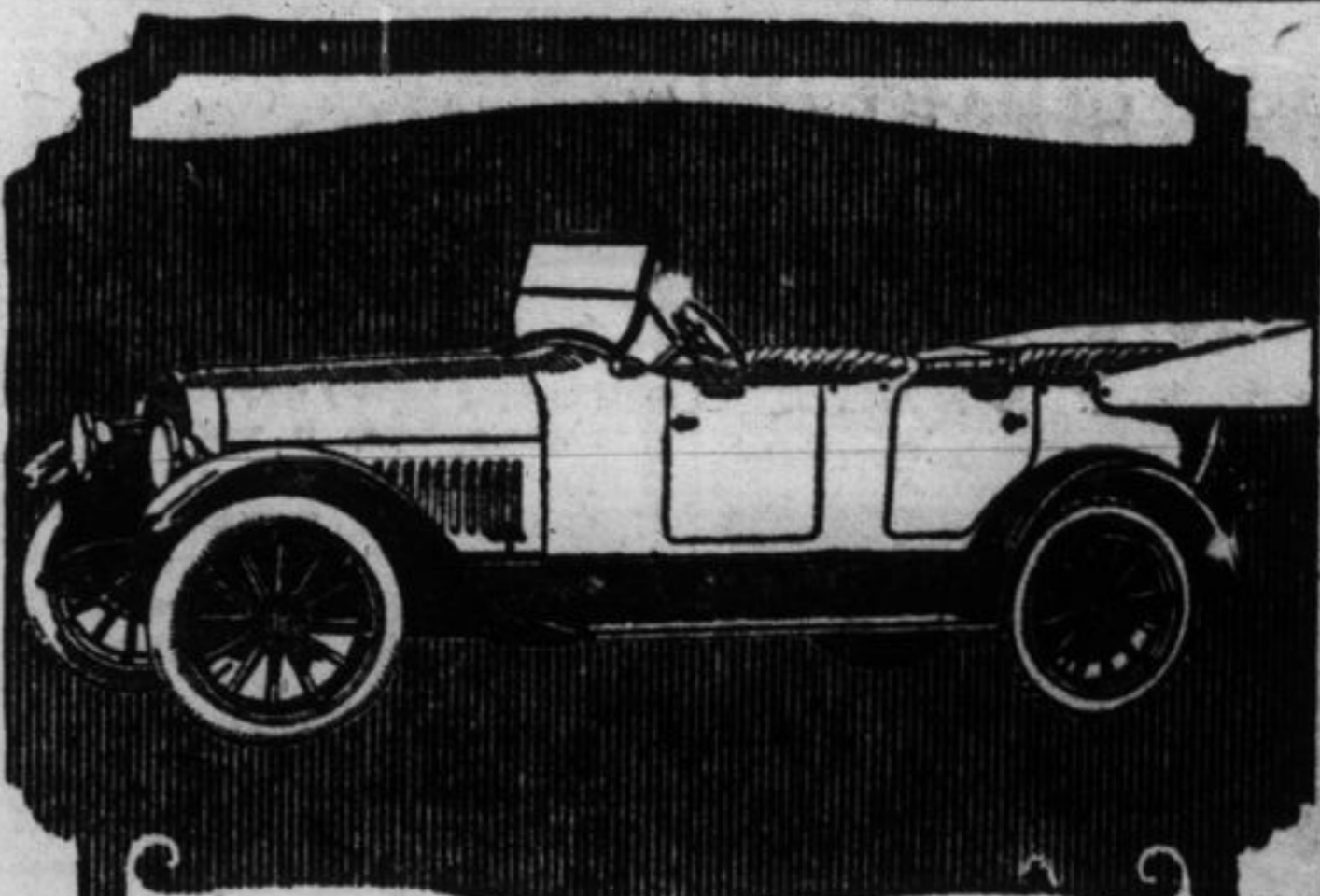
