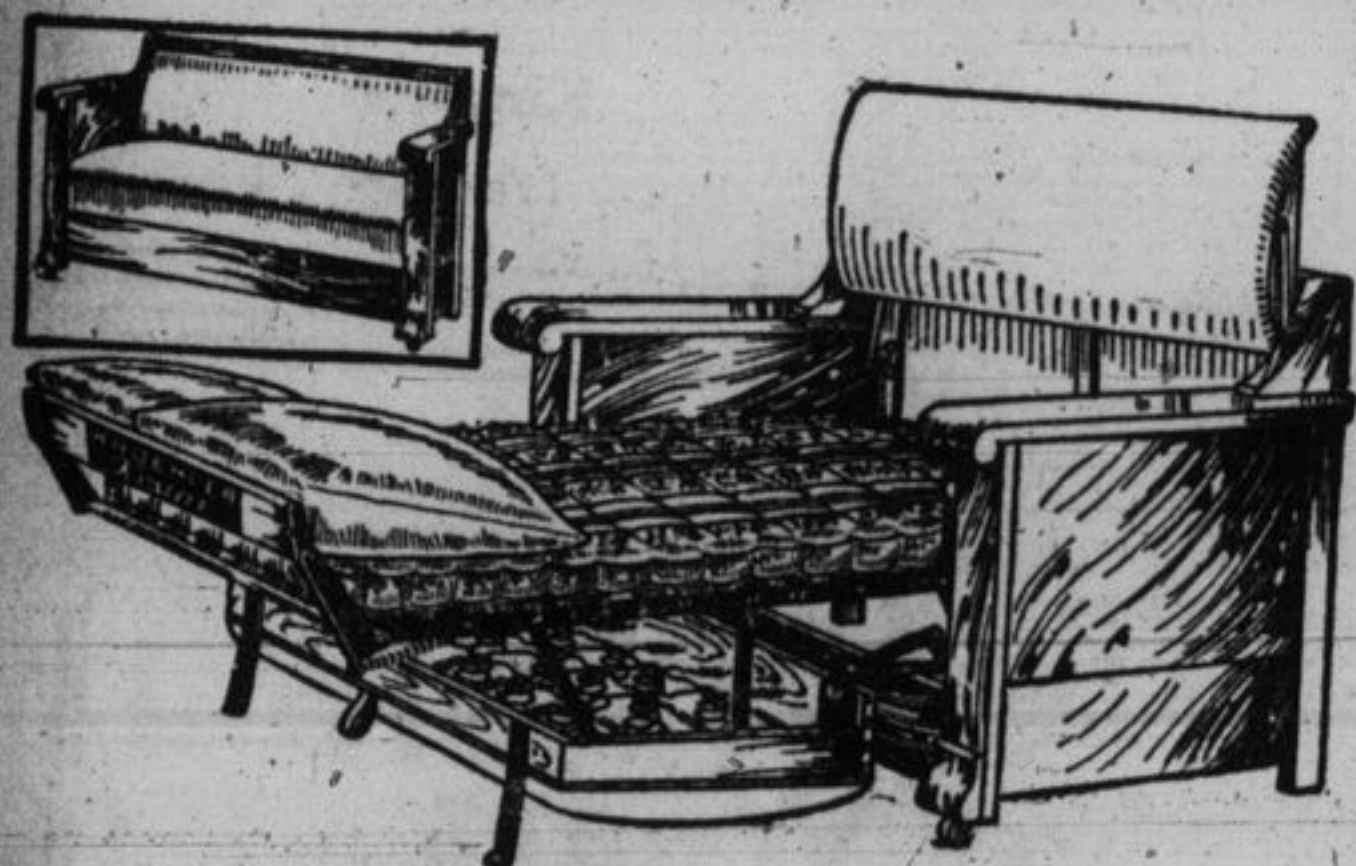

RAISE FUND TO SEND PRO. GOLFERS ABROAD

If professional golfers representing the United States fail to make a good showing in the next British open golf championship it won't be the fault of the Golf Illustrated. This publication, through its treasurer, J. A. Plummer, has made an offer to the Professional Golfers' Association to raise by popular subscription enough money to send from twelve to twenty "pros" abroad in 1921. It is reasoned that there is little chance for a golfer from the United States to win the British open title when but one or two make the attempt, whereas if a dozen or so were to attempt the task the chances of victory would be much greater.

COBB NOT EAGER TO BECOME A MANAGER

Ty Cobb, champion baseball player of all time, has no desire to become baseball manager—he just wants to be a player. Cobb is in San Francisco to play in a series of exhibition games. He admitted he had received offers to manage the Detroit Tigers. He said: "I am not figuring on becoming a manager right now. I never had any managerial experience and I don't crave it. Of course, you can't tell what will happen in time. When I'm through making hits and scoring runs and catching flies, I may take a whirl at running some ball club. I believe I am good for two or three years as a player."

"OUTLAW" LEAGUE CLUBS FACE FIGHT TO FINISH

Owners of the Philadelphia, St. Louis, Washington, Detroit and Louisville American league clubs—men who have supported President Ban Johnson of the league in several controversies this season and in past seasons—have until November 1st the opportunity of joining the league and entire eight of the National league in the reorganization of baseball or face the prospect of a fight to oust them from major league play.

REBUILDING WHITE SOX.

The Chicago White Sox have started to rebuild their shattered machine, according to reports. The once scrappy Hoosier, wrecked when seven of its players were indicted for throwing the 1919 world series, are badly in need of top-notch ball players and Charles A. Comiskey, owner, said he would offer the Baltimore club \$50,000 for three players. Two more players are sought from the St. Louis club, it was said. Comiskey is said to be willing to pay the Salsak \$30,000 for the two players he is believed to be after.

Lou Marsh's Suggestion.

Hamilton Spectator: Lou Marsh is out with a suggestion that teams playing the Tigers wear head gear with handles on, so that the Bengals will have a better hold when tackling high. Lou claims that the Tigers went so far as to gouge the Argos eyes in their attempt to bring them down in the game at Toronto, but of course that is an exaggeration of the real facts. While Lou is offering suggestions that straight-jackets would be in order for players who continue the rough work after the game is over, Lou, like the other Toronto writers, forgot to mention the unsportsmanlike tactics of Everett Smith in rushing at Bolt from behind and starting a free fight.

Eternal to Race Again.

James W. McClelland's Eternal, which was the champion two-year-old of 1918, will be put into training again next week, preparatory to coming back to the races next season, when he will be a five-year-old. He is now at Kalapa Farm, near Paris, Ky., where he will receive his first conditioning. Eternal is in fine condition, and has always been sound. He could have been brought to the track had many horses racing in the east and west that he decided to give this son of Sweep a rest for the season.

SPORT NOTES.

Foster of Veterinary College won the points championship at the annual University of Toronto track and field meet. Toronto Arena Gardens, Limited, has lost its appeal against the verdict awarding upwards of \$20,000 to the Toronto Hockey Club. Most of the professional gamblers who engineered the betting coup in connection with the world series last year have disappeared. Two hundred boxers have reported to the coach at the University of Toronto. The sport is being introduced in high schools throughout Ontario. The baseball team of the University of Southern California is planning for a tour of Japan next summer, to play the teams of Japanese universities. Vardon and Ray, British pro. golfers, are preparing for another invasion of Canada before returning to England.
