A SETTLEMENT MAY BE MADE
Big Railway Strike in Britain Postponed to Permit Conference.

London, Oct. 25.—The nation-wide railway strike, scheduled to start at midnight Sunday as a sympathetic demonstration with the miners' walk out, was postponed Saturday evening.

The calling off of the strike followed a conference of the executive boards of the railway workers and miners, at which the latter asked the postponement of the grounds the threat of a sympathetic strike would prove embarrassing at a new conference with the government to which they had been invited by Premier Lloyd George.

The official statement issued by the miners said that, acting on their advice, the railway workers had suspended their sympathetic strike to "give every opportunity for an honorable settlement." The suspension, it was said, would continue during the period of negotiations between the miners and the government.

The Evening Standard said it understood that the premier would present a new formula at the confer-

ence which already had received the unofficial approval of several leaders of the miners.

The readiness with which the railwaymen acceded to the miners' proposal was accepted as a victory for J. H. Thomas, secretary of the railway union, who had opposed the strike from the start and had formally refused to be a participant.

Thomas represented the more conservative element of the union, while the radicals were headed by Charles T. Cramp, the president.

Predictions were freely made in official circles that, with the action of the miners in seeking postponement of the railway strike indicating a change in their attitude, the renewal of negotiations would bring about a quick settlement and operation of the mines would be resumed shortly on a compromise agreement.

Negotiations in Progress.

London, Oct. 25.—Premier Lloyd George and members of the government this morning conferred with government experts concerning a new set of figures for wages of coal miners and production of coal industry.

Later the government leaders and representatives of the miners met and continued negotiations being Sunday for a settlement of the miners' strike.

An anti-cigarrette campaign among students to be inaugurated soon was announced at the Thomas by Major Fred Smith, of the Y. M. C. A. National Council.
