SHAUGHNESSY IS NOT UNDER-RATING QUEEN'S

A Montreal despatch says: Shaughnessy will take advantage of this game to try out a number of new men on the line. He is not under-rating the Queen's team and will have the players fit and ready for a gruelling game. He will take no chance of a repetition of 1913, when Queen's was the only team to defeat McGill. Flanagan, who has been confined to the General Hospital since the Toronto game, will likely be out Thursday. He may not be played in the game against Queen's, although it was reported last night that he had practically recovered from the injury received at Toronto, which was a badly bruised muscle.

CARPENTIER SURE HE CAN DEFEAT DEMPSEY

Tom Webster, famous cartoonist of the London Daily Mail, who has been vacationing in the United States for three months, has sailed for home from New York. Tom is one of those regular fellows, very fond of boxing, who never overlooks an opportunity to see the boys perform.

It is when Georges Carpentier's name is mentioned that Webster grows enthusiastic. The true he watched Carpentier come along from the bantam to the heavyweight division and is satisfied the Frenchman is the greatest fighter in the world.

"Carpentier's style was severely criticized by the experts after his fight with Levinisky, but the people don't know him," he said. "Carpentier's style is governed by the attitude of his opponent. If his opponent is a clever worker, the Frenchman performs accordingly. Should he meet a soft mark like Levinisky he is likely to abandon respect for cleverness and pitch in headlong in his desire to complete the job.

"That is what happened in his fight with Levinisky. The American proved nothing more than a stationary target and when Georges missed a few wild swings it was he who looked bad, but he is not likely to do that while facing a man like Dempsey.

"Another thing about the Frenchman is his absolute confidence in himself. Carpentier told me he did not consider Dempsey a superman, and had no fear of Jack's wallop. Carpentier thinks he carries a fairly healthy punch himself, and believes that any time he stands a man on the button the latter is likely to leave the picture.

When asked if there was any chance that Carpentier's defeat of Beckett was a fluke, Webster dropped a pencil to explain. "Not a bit. Carpentier tanned Beckett that night in one round and can do the same thing again. Carpentier is the class, I tell you, and don't overlook him. He'll stand a chance with Dempsey or any other man he fights."

CARPENTIER IS SORE ON THE UNITED STATES

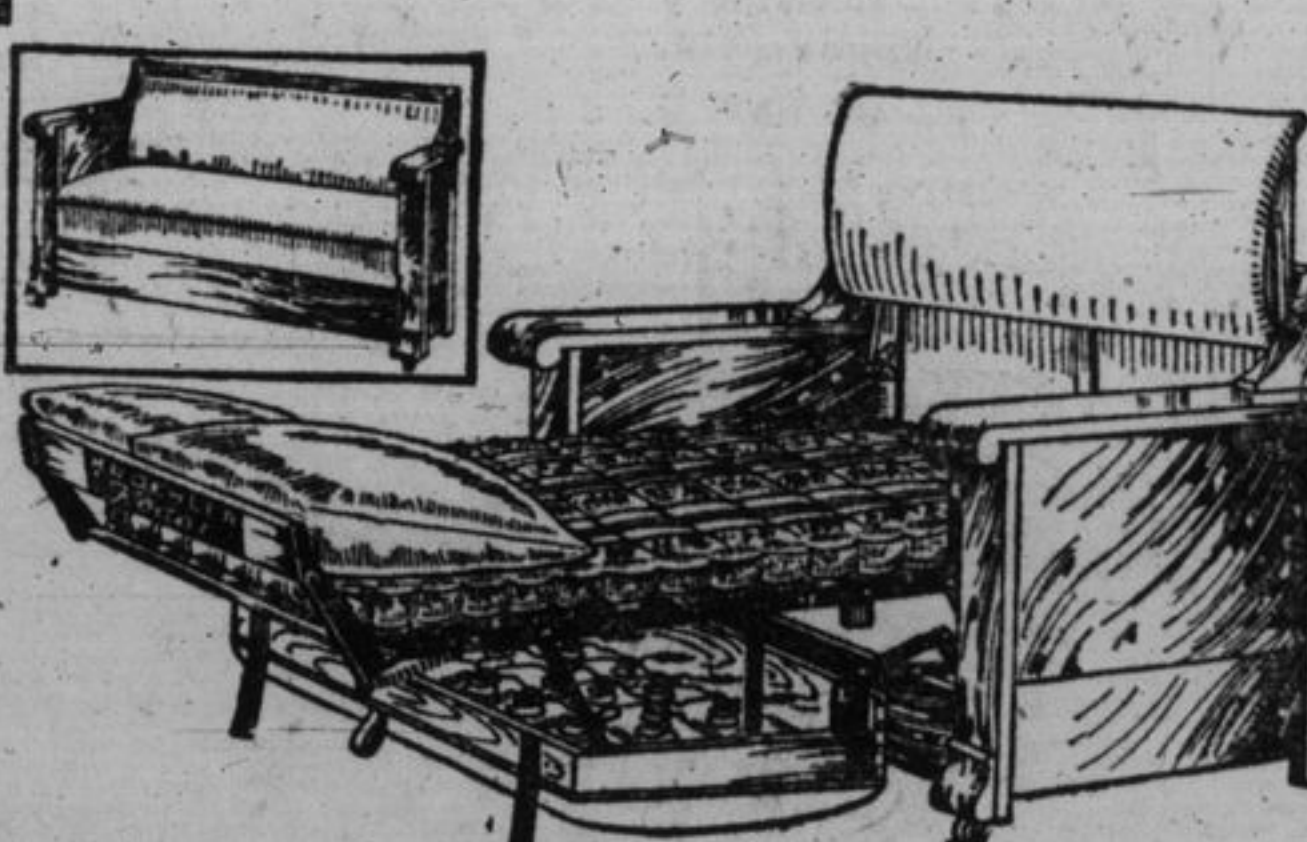
