

A BABOON SWITCHMAN.

From time to time numerous amasing stories have been told of the sagacity of members of the monkey tribe; but the following account is so particularly extraordinary that it would cause doubt in the minds of the most credulous were it not fold on the authority of Mr. W. C. Scully and the Atlantic Monthly.

"The most remarkable instance of simian intelligence that has come under my personal observation," says


