HELD "INDIAN EVENING"

Address Given at Y.M.C.A. by Rev. A. Perry Park, Delhi, India.

The foreign work committee of the Y.M.C.A. conducted an enjoyable "Indian evening" at the local association rooms on Wednesday. Following supper, served by the woman's auxiliary, the president, E. W. Skinner, introduced Rev. A. Perry Park, B.A., who for the past six years has been the Y.M.C.A. general secretary at Delhi, India. Mr. Park gave some enlightening and interesting information as to the political, economic and social condition of that important country of the east, whose ready and noble response in the recent great war had aroused the admiration and respect of all other British subjects. There was a time when an expression like the "unchanging east" was generally accepted, but that time was no more, for the term "everchanging east" would be now applicable, owing to the tremendous reaching out after development and western civilization in a country like India, where self-government was being dished out, so to speak, on the installment plan, there was a demand for the kind of force not such as some denominated as that which "should make the world safe for democracy" but rather that force that would "make democracy safe for the world."

Mr. Park, in enumerating some of the features of the two great religions of India, pointed out that they did not provide the moral fibre and stability that would meet the critical situation, but Christianity and its ideals were rapidly being looked up to by many leaders of India. This latter truth was borne out by the expressions of some of the Indian students (when referring to a certain action), for instance, "That was not a Christian thing to do." This evidence that Christian standards were being recognized in few communities, which had the benefit of Christian contact, surely pressed home the need of further extension.

There was also a demand for "woman suffrage" in India, despite the fact that ninety-five per cent. of Indian women were not literate in any language, and manhood suffrage is also strongly meted in this country where only ten per cent. of its men can read and write. The work of the Y.M.C.A. among Indian troops has intensified the desire for the Y.M.C.A. in the Indian cities and villages, of which there are 270,000; whereas at present the "Y" is operating in only 250 of these, but with entire satisfaction of Indian government, who particularly approve of its co-operative banks, which are rapidly assisting the poor Indian peasant to unload his burden of debt.

Mr. Park remained in the city today in order to try and interest a number of business men, in a financial way, to assist in Canada's share in the foreign work budget for 1920, which amounts to \$100,000.

The demand for kewpie dolls is so great that the committee engaged on this work, under Sister Genevieve, has had to wire for a special supply. On Saturday special kewpie dolls will be available for McGill, Varsity and Queen's students and football players. They will be interesting souvenirs of the championship game played here on that day.

The demand, following the announcement that meals would be served from 12 to 2 p.m. and from 5 to 7 p.m., was so great that special efforts have had to be made to accommodate the crowds that came to patronize them. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday the management is in a position to supply all comers. On Friday both fish and meat courses will be on the menu. On Saturday afternoon there will be a tea and dance, and the patronesses will be Lady Macdonell, Mrs. R. Bruce Taylor and Mrs. J. S. N. Leslie.

Rev. Mother Clement, when interviewed Thursday, expressed her warm appreciation of the manner in which the bazaar was being supported. She regretted that owing to the hurry and bustle occasioned by hours of activity, the ladies were often unable to make personal acknowledgements of contributions, and on behalf of herself and those associated with her she expressed deep gratitude. She had the greatest praise for the ladies of the societies who have taken much of the burden away from her, and have given so freely of their time and talents. The public, too, that since the very beginning of the bazaar has been so liberal in its support, receives her deep gratitude. Rev. Mother Clement, in addition to being a splendid executive, is a woman of kindly disposition, tactful, and keen-

ly appreciative of value of organization and the merits of those whom she entrusts with responsibility. The zeal shown in all of the departments bears testimony to devotion that surrounds her.
