Wet Majority in British Columbia Was 34,947.

Vancouver, B.C., Nov. 19 .- Government control has a majority of 34.947 over prohibition in the whole of British Columbia, with the excep-tion of Atlin district, according to final returns from the plebiscite vote of October 20th, made public by the official government returning officer today. The totals are: Government control, 89,688; prohibition, 54,741. There were 1,637 rejected ballots.

Out of a total of 200,892 registered voters in the province, 146,666 voted on the liquor plebiscite. Onl; two districts out of 39 voted dry. The final returns from Atlin, where there are 1,640 votes, are not in.
