New Boxing Regulations. The rules and regulations adopted by the Ontario Athletic commission will be distributed to boxers, managers and promoters within the next few days. Every detail in connection with boxing can be covered. One of the rules will deal with the matter of weight and will not permit of a match in which there is any great difference in avoirdupois. Strict medical examination before entering the ring is another feature of the rules which is considered important and no private agreement between boxers will be sanctioned. It is the intention of the commission to have a working agreement with all the commissions across the border and the rulings will be recognized in all places, so that a boxer set down by the Ontario body will have little chance to perform any place.




