LYNCH TEACHES ODEN TO THROW FOOTBALL IN BASEBALL STYLE

Col. Michael J. Lynch, former Brown University baseball star, who received a tryout with the New York Giants in 1907, is being credited as being responsible for the deadly accuracy of Gus Oden, Brown quarterback, in throwing the forward pass. Lynch is working on the theory that a football can be passed with the accuracy of a baseball with proper training, and he has been coaching Oden in throwing the ball. The coaching of Lynch is bearing fruit, and Oden is now regarded as one of the best passers in football. Lynch, who is a member of governor R. Livingston's staff, makes his home in Providence.

CHAMPION FALCONS MAY PLAY IN O. H. A.

With the arrival of Frank Frederickson, captain of the champion Falcon hockey team, in Winnipeg, hockey fans of that city were given a surprise with the announcement that Frederickson is endeavoring to enlist the entire Falcon hockey team for duty at Camp Borden with the Canadian Air Force this winter. Frederickson, who has been flying at Camp Borden for the past few weeks, plans to interest the boys in the flying profession and to endeavor to get a place in the O. H. A. to play senior hockey, the games to be played at Barrie or Toronto.

RUSH TO RESERVE SEATS FOR HEAVYWEIGHT BOUT

Although the important matter of setting a definite date and place for the world's heavyweight championship bout between Jack Dempsey and Georges Carpentier has not yet been attended to, Promoter Tex Rickard is daily in receipt of requests for choice seat reservations. The latest request for a reservation was received yesterday on behalf of the Argentine ambassador, Dr. Tomas Le Breton, who is eager to reserve three ring-side seats for the bout. Enrique Gil, of the law firm of Aldao, Campos & Gil, New York, made the request. The 800 members of the Madison Square Garden Sporting Club have also submitted their applications to Promoter Rickard.

PREFERS DEMPSEY'S PUNCH TO THAT OF CARPENTIER

Boxing fans, who are of the opinion that George Carpentier will be a "set up" for the world's champion, Jack Dempsey should listen to Battling Levinsky. According to the "Battler," Carpentier is a much better puncher than the man who knocked the crown off Jess Willard's head in Toledo. "I've tested the hitting ability of the two men," said Levinsky as his seconds tried to soothe his wounded feelings, and I know what I am talking about. Why, when that Frenchman hit me with that right wallop in the second round that knocked me down, I thought a building had fallen on me. That was the punch that sent me on my way, and I never was right after that."

WILL SHIFT THE INFIELD OF NEW YORK GIANTS

A shift in the infield of the New York Nationals for next season was announced today by Manager McGraw previous to his departure with President Chas. A. Stoneham to Cuba for the racing season. Joe Rupp, purchased yesterday from the St. Paul American Association team, will be used at third base, McGraw said, and Frank Frisch will be switched to second, where the Giant manager believes he will be more valuable. Combined with shortstop Bancroft and first baseman Kelly, the infield will be the strongest he has had since New York won the pennant three times in a row, he claimed.

To Enforce The Rules.

The Ottawa Citizen says: The action of the Intercollegiate football union officials in donating the receipts of the coming final game at Kingston to the Queen's team is an evidence of the high quality of sportsmanship in the college organizations. Queen's is experiencing one of those spells that come to the best of clubs at times, and for several years has been on the short end of the winning list at the end of the season. Incidents such as this are not so plentiful that they should be allowed to pass unnoticed. Our colleges are doing a splendid work in developing the character of our future leaders in all branches of endeavor when they instill into them principles of fairness, generosity and true sportsmanship for the game's sake.

New Boxing Regulations.

The rules and regulations adopted by the Ontario Athletic commission will be distributed to boxers, managers and promoters within the next few days. Every detail in connection with boxing can be covered. One of the rules will deal with the matter of weight and will not permit of a match in which there is any great difference in avoirdupois. Strict medical examination before entering the ring is another feature of the rules which is considered important and no private agreement between boxers will be sanctioned. It is the intention of the commission to have a working agreement with all the commissions across the border and the rulings will be recognized in all places, so that a boxer set down by the Ontario body will have little chance to perform any place.

GOLF MAY BECOME ARBITER OF FASHION IN WOMEN'S SKIRTS

Is it possible that golf is to become the arbiter of women's fashions? Recently a New York young woman was heard to order a tailor-made tweed skirt, which she declared emphatically must not be of a width which would allow her to take a pace between her feet of more than twenty-two inches. "But surely this is on the narrow side," exclaimed the tailor in dismay. "It cannot be helped," said the young woman, firmly. "My golf professional says that in my practice I keep my feet too far apart when driving. It is all right when he is there to guide me, but when I am playing on my own account I cannot judge the distance. If I have my skirt exactly twenty-two inches wide I cannot possibly go wrong." FRENCH GIRL'S HIGH JUMP CLAIMED AS WORLD'S RECORD

Miss. Elsie Constant, of the Caen, Normandy, Gymnastic Society, cleared the bar at 1.10 metre and 42 centimetres (about 4 feet 6 1/2 inches) at the Cormelies Stadium. The performance was under the control of the Athletic Commission of Lower Normandy. The French claim that this is a world's record for the women's high jump. The women's running high jump record, accepted by the Amateur Athletic Union and included in the official list of records, is 4 feet 3 inches, held by Miss D. Horer, of St. Mary's Hall. The women's standing high jump record is 4 feet, and is held by Miss Ruth Spencer of Lake Erie College.

ATLANTIC CITY HAS CHANCE TO GET BOUT

Atlantic City may be seriously considered for the Dempsey-Carpentier world's championship bout, according to William A. Brady, one of the promoters. Brady, in an interview declared that he sees no reason why the resort would not make an ideal spot for the contest. Brady said that he has been approached by an Atlantic City man who pledged financial support, as spokesman for a committee. The promoter said that it remained for the resort to make as strong a bid, if not stronger, than any other city for the battle.

Frank Black, matchmaker of the Sportsmen's Club of Newark, N.J., offers a purse of \$40,000 for champion Benny Leonard and champion Jack Britton to meet in a twelve-round no-decision bout Thanksgiving Day.
