#### DIFFICULTY EXPERIENCED IN CATCHING RUGBY PUNT

Few who watch football games realize the difficulty attendant on catching a punt. One reason for this is because so few know the course the ball takes after it is booted.

Everyone knows the spin given by the kicker's boot which causes the ball to descend with its longest axis perpendicular to the ground. Technically this is called a spiral. But the receiver that the imparting of the spiralling motion to the ball has the same effect as a cut applied with a tennis racquet. That is, it causes the ball to cut sharply outward when it starts to descend. From the viewpoint of the player catching the ball, its course is much like what we called an outdrop in our sandlot days.

When it is considered that a wind of any sort adds to the sharpness of the curve the ball takes in descending and that catches are made with a horde of players swarming down on the receiver ready to dash him to earth as viciously and heavily as they possibly can, it becomes a marvel that punts are handled so cleanly as a general rule.

#### INSIST THAT GIRLS WEAR HIGHER BATHING SUITS

Girl swimmers who compete in amateur athletic union contests in future must wear swimming suits that come higher about the neck and must be cut with a due allowance for shrinkage, under a rule adopted at the final session of the annual convention of the union at New Orleans.

Judge Bartow S. Weeks, chairman of the Legislative Committee, described the low cut and tight fitting suits worn by United States girls in the Olympic games and said these girls had been criticised by the Europeans. Under the terms of the new ruling regulation suits must be worn by both men and women.

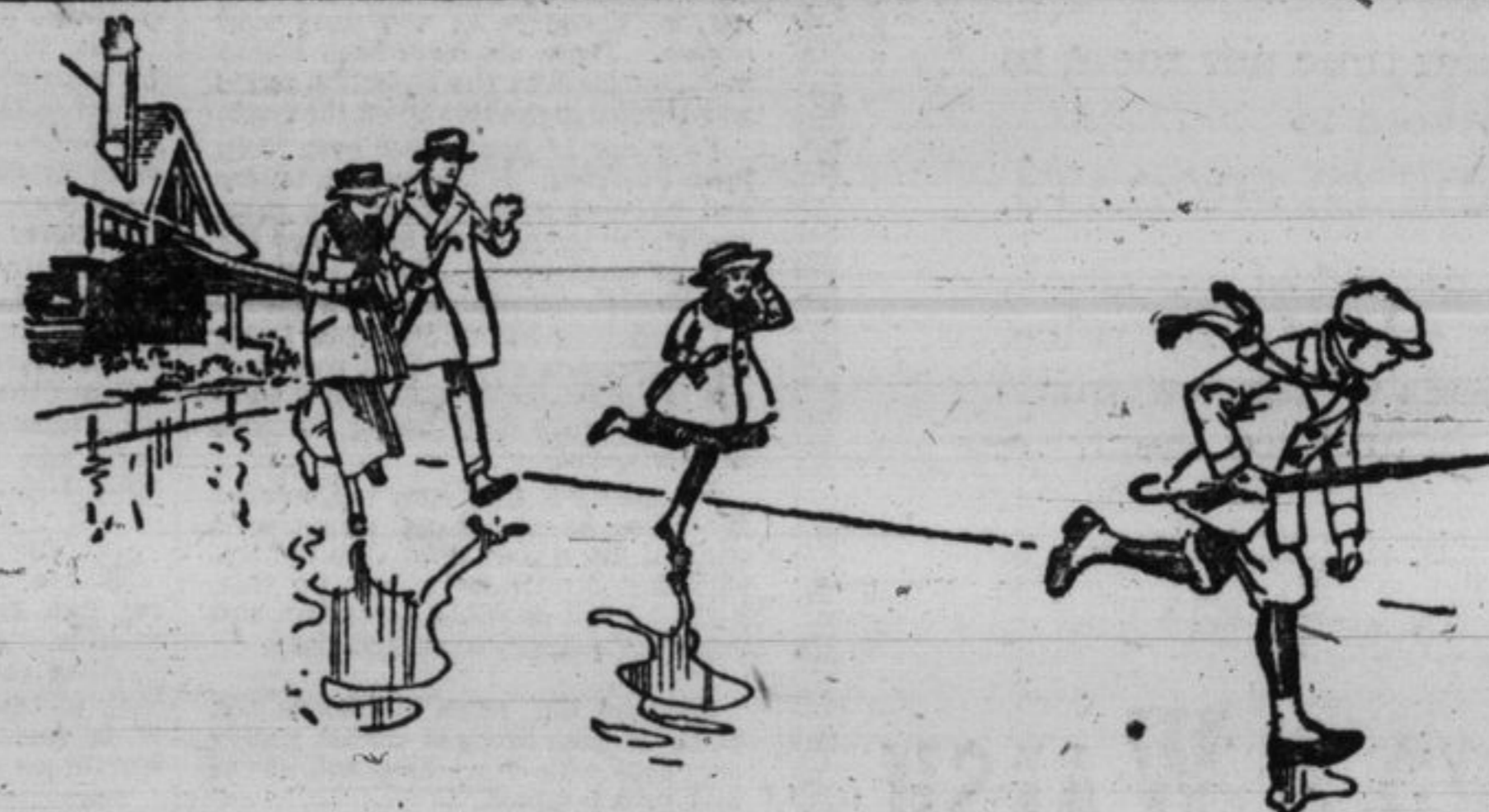
