NOVEL WHALE CAUGHT.

It had a Humpback and Two Hind Limbs.

New York, Nov. 20.—Capture off the coast of British Columbia of a remarkable humpback whale with two hind limbs became known here recently when the bones of the unique appendages arrived at the American Museum of Natural History.

Back in prehistoric ages, they said, the multitree granddads of modern whales may have strutted about on land. But, so far as they knew, no other whale, with bones outside the body had ever been seen by man.

There was no earthly or watery reason for the rear legs on the whale found off the British Columbia coast. It couldn't walk on them, as they were but four-foot long, while the whale weighed several tons.
