THE U.S. RETAILERS' FACE TRADE CRISIS

Steadily Falling Prices Leads to Organization of New Association.

New York, Nov. 25.—Continuance of the process of readjustment in prices of commodities is indicated by reports to-day from many parts of the United States. In New York representatives of more than 1,200 retailers of clothing, dry goods, shoes and millinery from many cities yesterday organized the council of national retail associations in an effort to meet the crisis in the retail trade due to steadily falling prices. The policy of the new organization was not made public.

In Boston the state commission on necessities of life announced that in October, living costs declined 2 1/2 p.c. from the levels of September. One decrease mentioned was a drop of 12 p.c. in the price of women's silk stockings. Two shoe manufacturers in St. Louis announced further reductions in the wholesale prices of certain styles of shoes. Two large roofing manufacturers in Chicago announced price reductions in asphalt shingles and prepared roofings ranging from three to 35 p.c. The largest rebating company in Ogden, Utah, announced that effective at once the size of its loaves of bread would be increased ten per cent., the price to remain as at present.

A majority of the wholesale bakers of Youngstown, Ohio, announced a 20 p.c. reduction in the price of bread, effective November 29th.

Under the new price, the cost of a 24 ounce loaf of bread will be reduced from 19 to 15 cents.

The seventh annual meeting of the Ontario Associated Boards of Trade and Chambers of Commerce opened in Belleville Thursday morning, and was largely attended by delegates from various parts of the province.
