Landmarks of Mackenzie

INCE William Lyon Mackensie King, the Liberal leader, has been visiting some of the shrines of his illustrious forebear, from whom he gets his Christian names, it is permissible for the average citisen, regardless of his politics, to do the same.

A substantial monument has been erected to William Lyon Mackensie in the same God's acre where a granite shaft commemorates Lount and Matthews, two of his chief lieutenants, who gave up their lives for the faith they had in their leader and his cause.

Parts of the basement walls of the old Toronto Jail, in a cell of which Lount and Matthews were kept till their execution, are still traceable in the office building at the southeast corner of Toronto and Court streets. From the Necropolis we pass to Bond street where at No. 82 stands the three-storey dwelling in which the Board of Railway Commissioners Mackenzie died. 


