# RUSSIA OR GALILEE?

The International Sunday School Lesson for Dec. 12th is, "What the Kingdom of Heaven is Like."—Matt. 13: 44-58.

In strange and dissonant melody, the whole earth is crying for Kingdom Come. What prophets foretold and poets sang and saints sighed for and Jesus proclaimed is today the major theme of universal thought. All sorts of voices are uplifted in plea for this Better Day, which men variously interpret. Gilbert K. Chesterton, the British author, expresses the common passion in this prayer:

"Oh God of earth and altar  
Bow down and hear our cry,  
Our earthly rulers alter;  
Our people drift and die;  
The walls of gold entomb us,  
The swords of scorn divide,  
Take not Thy thunder from us,  
But take away our pride.  
From all that terror teaches,  
From lies of tongue and pen,  
From all the easy speeches,  
That comfort cruel men,  
From sale and profanation,  
Of honor and the sword,  
From sleep and from damnation,  
Deliver us, good Lord.

"Tie in a living tether  
The priest and prince and thrall,  
Bind all our lives together,  
Smite us and save us all;  
In ire and exultation,  
Affame with faith and free,  
Lift us a living nation,  
A single word to Thee."

Chesterton, in spite of his paradoxes and whimsies sees straighter than most. Sensative to popular unrest, he yet perceives that it is not something to be allayed or overcome or exterminated, but to be satisfied. Therefore he turns to the great Source and Goal of life, from whom alone can come the answer to mankind's expectancy.

**A Worth-While Passion.**  
Recently I addressed a forum meeting upon cosmopolitan conditions, and answered questions afterwards. A few professional forum-goers were there, apostles of unrest, critics of all things that are. They seemed disappointed because the speaker did not prove to be a common scold, and had enthusiasms as well as regrets. Their point of view was really pitiable, for their only apparent programme was damnation for the whole general scheme of things. They made the common mistake of assuming that mere fact-finding is a great virtue. Their idea of social reconstruction seemed to be entirely to rail at the meeting or order. They had no constructive conceptions whatever.  
Really I fancy that I am a superior over some existing conditions in the world than these untravelled

and narrow-minded critics know how to be. They are incapable even of imagining such misery as these eyes have looked upon. But I part company with this whole brood of calamity howlers—they remind me of the packs of jackals that make weird noises amid the graves outside of the sacred shrine city of Kerbela, in Mesopotamia—because I have a glowing faith in people, and in some institutions; and I have a programme which is able to make right all that is wrong in the world.

**Take The Express Train.**  
That programme and passion is for the kingdom of heaven, established by Jesus, and still growing over all the earth. Why should a person devote his energies to any lesser and merely superficial scheme of reconstruction, when he can go right down to the root of things with the word and spirit and method of Jesus? Why take a slow and uncomfortable local train, stopping at all the wayside stations of reform, when it is possible to take a through express to the terminal of regeneration?

A babe may follow the logic of the kingdom idea. The things that are wrong with the world today all have their cause in mistaken or evil ideals. It is man's inhumanity to man that is making countless millions mourn. If it were not for the pride and greed and selfishness of the imperialists, the profiteers and the huge mass of self-engrossed persons in the world, there would be no political or economic or social tragedies. Because man's heart is not right toward his neighbor, our world has sunk into its present abyss of unneighborliness. So, says Jesus, get your heart right. Changed spirits will quickly produce a changed world. All reform that abides must work from within outward. Therefore, "the kingdom of God is within you." Passionate devotion to the kingdom is surest service of all human needs.

### Seeing Red or Seeing Straight.

Perturbed persons everywhere are turning toward Russia as a possible land of hope for the new era. It is the fad among so-called "intellectuals" to espouse the Russian type of radicalism as the panacea for all ills. One of the rather amazing phenomena of our present world is this widespread turning towards Russia for a new gospel. Those of us who have lived under the red flag in Russia know that the advent of Bolshevism has meant even increased tyranny, intolerance, and widespread suffering, physical, mental and spiritual. Sorry is our plight if we have nowhere else to look for the Good Time Coming than to Russia.

Happily, we have a better place toward which we may turn our eyes of hope. Not out of Russia, but out of Galilee, comes the assurance of the New Day, when

"All men's good  
Be each man's rule and universal  
Like like a shaft of light across the  
land,  
And like a lane or beams athwart the  
sea,  
Thro' all the circle of the golden  
year.

Why, we cease seeing red, and begin to see straight and far, we perceive clearly that only the Kingdom of heaven programme, as studied in the present Sunday School Lesson, is adequate for a remade world. Our day's problem is so vast that nothing less than the transforming power of a divine dynamic can meet it. Humanity will have to be changed in its very heart before all the undesirable conditions of society can be changed. Jesus is the only sufficient Leader who can meet the unequalled task of the times.

**What Is The Kingdom?**  
Even as it was in the days of His flesh, the learned and the eminent are inclined to be offended in Jesus saying "Whence hath this man this wisdom, and such mighty works as these are done in him?" That very fact, that Jesus is so kin to all of us that He bears the title of the "Son of man," of course fit Him to meet a universal need and win universal acceptance.

By a variety of parables, Jesus sets forth, in the Scripture assigned for present study, some characteristics of the kingdom of heaven. It is like a mustard seed, inconspicuous in its beginnings, but great and beneficent in its growth. It is like a leaven, hid in the flour, and leavening the whole lump. It is like treasure secreted in a field, making the entire property worth buying. It is like the merchant's pearl of great price, supremely desirable. It is like a net, gathering in the good and the bad, for the subsequent separation. Naturally so vast a conception as that of the kingdom of heaven is susceptible of endless interpretation and comparison.

The kingdom is made by the King. Christ's kingdom is Christ's dominion over the hearts of men who give allegiance to Him. As men do His will, His kingdom comes. Where His way goes and grows, there His dominion is extended. It is a spiritual kingdom, knowing neither boundary of time nor boundary of space. The kingdom of God interpenetrates and overlays all earthly kingdoms. As people become subject to Christ, they are so made over in their characters that the truth and love which are the marks of citizenship in the heavenly kingdom inevitably transform earthly conditions.

All things desirable come with the coming of the kingdom of heaven. If Jesus Christ is a man—  
And only a man—I say  
That of all mankind I cleave to Him  
And to Him will I cleave always.  
If Jesus Christ is a god—  
And the only God, I swear—  
I will follow Him through Heaven  
and hell.
