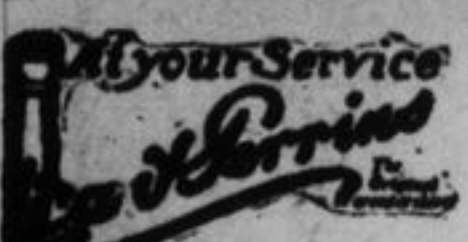

Hard Labor for O.T.A. Offender. Robert Burke, Belleville, was sentenced by Magistrate Masson to six months hard labor in jail, having been found guilty of selling liquor, it being his second offence. A brother of Burke is now serving a similar term for a like offence. A considerable quantity of liquor taken was ordered to be turned over to the department at Toronto.

He is a Good Type. A writer in the Montreal Gazette who criticizes Prof. Morison's lecture on Ireland says: "The temper of the address was excellent. Prof. Morison is the perfect type of present-day old country Liberal, well-disposed towards Irishmen, but hurt that after years of looking for salvation from English Liberalism, the rising generation of Irishmen have decided to rely on 'Ourselves'."

Death of Mrs. A. H. Mitchell. Mrs. Almedia Hyneman Mitchell, wife of Dennis L. Mitchell, died Nov. 23rd at the family residence, Rutland, N.Y., following a long illness, aged forty-eight years. She had been in failing health during the last three years and her condition during the past month had been critical. She was born in Picton, Ont., Feb. 11th, 1872, daughter of the late Na-

thaniel and Margaret Mowers Hyneman. She had spent her early life in Canada, but had been a resident of Rutland six years.

Thirty-Seven Years in Council. While in Perth, attending the last session for 1920 of the Lanark county council, Reeve William Pattie, Carleton Place, intimated to a number of his fellow councillors that he intended retiring from municipal politics at the end of the year. Mr. Pattie's record municipally has been a remarkable one. He has been a member of the county council continuously for the lengthy period of thirty-seven years and during that time he was opposed on only four occasions for election. For some time he has been looked upon as the "father" and "grand old man" of the council.

Was Seriously Injured. On Monday last D. Floyd, Tamworth, met with a painful accident when lifting a heavy box in his store, causing such injuries that Dr. Bogart, Kingston, found it necessary to perform an operation immediately to save his life. Although Mr. Floyd is still seriously indisposed his condition is much improved. During the last month Mr. Floyd has been very busy enlarging and renovating his store preparatory to the Christmas trade. It is very unfortunate that he should have met with this accident at this particular time of the year, but we hope that his injury will prove to be less serious than at first supposed, and that he will soon be able to again direct the business of his store.

A Fine Appearance. Princess street, between Bagot and Wellington streets presented the appearance of fairyland on Saturday evening, and the hundreds of citizens out to do their shopping were loud in their praises of the enterprising merchants who conceived the idea of decorating the street with evergreens and the wonderful display of colored lights. It is a magnificent spectacle and a royal greeting to all Christmas shoppers. The lamp posts are surrounded with fine white frosts between the tops of the posts are strung myriads of red, white and green lamps. Besides the store fronts are most attractive. Hundreds of people of all ages lined the streets throughout the evening, but this block was the centre of attraction.
