MUST OBSERVE UNIFORM CODE OF ROAD RULES

Railway Commission Issues an Order With Regard to Station Limits.

Ottawa, Dec. 13.-Judgment has been issued by the railway commission in complaint of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and the Brotherhodd of Firemen in regard to special instruction "E" C.P.R. timetable, covering station limits. The order requires the Canadian Pacific and all other railways under the jurisdiction of the board to withdraw special instruction "E" from their timetables and hereafter observe the uniform code of rules for Canadian railways, approved by order issued July 12th, 1909, the necessary instructions to employees to become effective June 1st, 1921.

## With Telephone in Hand

Quebec, Dec. 13 .- E. Gerard Hamel, aged thirty, assistant secretary of the Quebec harbor commission, was found dead in his office Saturday afternoon, with the telephone receiver in his left hand, a revolver in his right, and a bullet wound over the right temple. Friends say he had been brooding over domestic troubles for some time.

MAY BE CANDIDATE

Widow of Premier May Run in Vic-

Victoria, B.C., Dec. 13 .- If Premier Oliver decides to hold his Delta seat and resign the one in Victoria, Lady McBride, widow of the former premier of this province, may be the Conservative candidate. The Conservatives here plan to bring her out." They claim that she will not only poll a big woman's vote but make a strong sentimental appeal generally, and particularly to men who used to be McBride voters. Premier Oliver said he did not know yet whether there would be a bye-election in Victoria.

PREDICTS DOOM OF SUBMARINE Terror of Seacraft to Navy Practically

Non-Existant. London, Dec. 13 .- The doom of the submarine is predicted by Archibald Hurd, naval expert of the Daily Telegraph, in a special article published by that paper. He points out that even in July, 1916, the hydrohone made it possible to detect the presence of submarines. With the further improvements which have been introduced as a means of locating submarines the terror of the seacraft to a navy has become practically non-existent, he declares.

DONE WITH DAYLIGHT SAVING.

Bill to Repeal Act Introduced in New York, Dec. 13.—Daylight sav-ing is at an end in New York. The

act will be cut out of the statute, books at the earliest possible time after Governor-elect Nathan L. Miller takes office.

Word that the long fight led by the cities for the daylight saving system, with all the farmers of the state fighting it, had been lost came from a conference at the headquarters of the Republican State Committee.

Made Lieutenant-General. Ottawa, Dec. 13 .- Sir Willoughby G. Gwatkin, K.C.M.G., C.B., on Dec. 21st, will be transferred to the reserve of officers with the honorary rank of lieutenant-general. Some weeks ago he was appointed air vicemarshal, and in that position is in charge of the organization of the Canadian air force to which he will devote his energies in future.

W. Power, Ex-M.P., Quebec, Dead. Quebec, Dec. 13.—William Power, one of the managers of W. and J. Sharples, timber merchants, died here Saturday, aged seventy-one. He represented Quebec West in the federal house for several terms.
