FRENCH ARE PRISONERS.

Holding Men.

Released Captive Says Germans Still

Paris, Dec. 13 .- That French soldiers are still kept prisoners in Germany was the sensational statement of Private Joseph Blin, of the twenty-sixth Territorial Regiment, before a court of inquiry at LeMans. Blin, who was captured early in the war, has only just been allowed to return to France after the personal intervention of General Dupont, head of the French mission in Germany. It appears that he received severe injuries to his head when working as a prisoner at the time of the armistice and was shut up as mad. Later he was released, but the Germans refused to give him papers or allow him

Blin claims positive knowledge that other Frenchmen are in the same situation and the French mission has been instructed to hold an inquiry.
