The slippery roads gave the horses much trouble on Thursday morning, and unless the animals were well shod, they found it impossible to keep up.

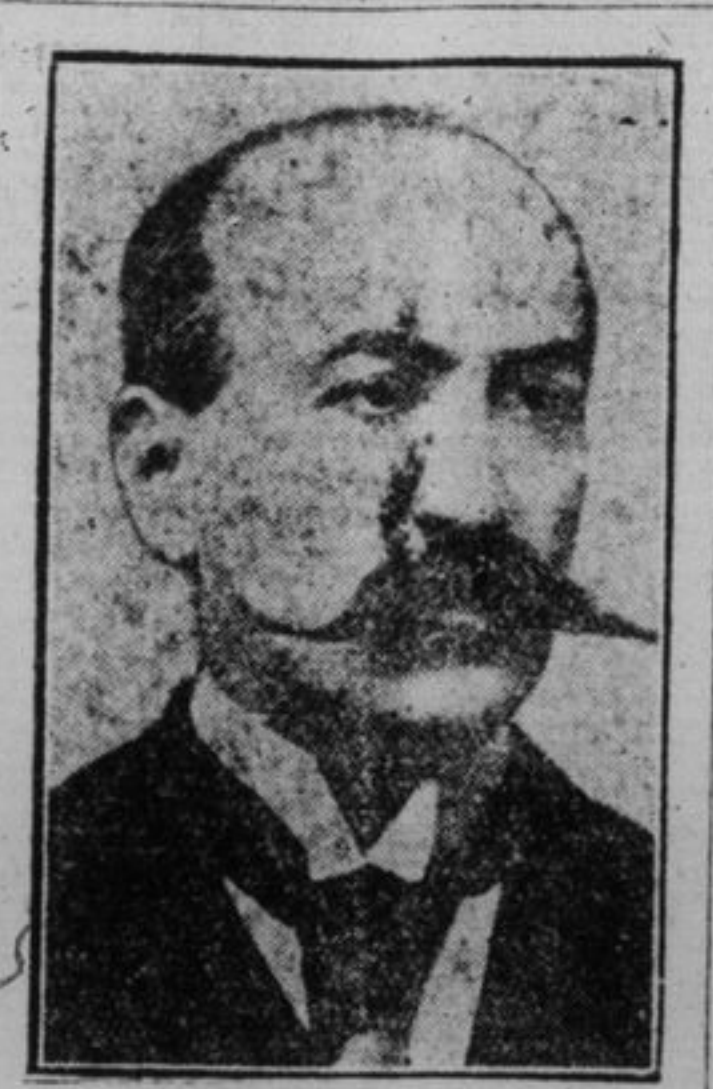
The weather was disagreeable for the Christmas shopping on Wednesday night, but in spite of this the stores were filled with shoppers.
