Washington, Jan. 12.—Rumors of all descriptions are current here this morning as to the official action to be taken regarding flight of three United States naval officers, which culminated in their descent at Moose Factory in Northern Ontario. It seems likely that a congressional enquiry will be held. Reports that the balloonists undertook the long flight so that they might furnish a long story which they could sell for publication, are certain to be inquired into, if a congressional examination is held. Reports that the trip was undertaken for mercenary purposes have been continually received by the navy department.
