

That honor belongs to Emeritus Professor George D. Ferguson, LL.D. He received the degree of B.A. in 1851. He is still hale and active, and may be seen striding along the city's streets at a pace that might be envied by a freshman of to-day. Rev. Robert Campbell, D.D., Montreal, graduated in 1856, and is still wonderfully energetic and swift of foot, bearing the burden of his years and learning lightly, like a flower. Next to these in order of time are three. all residing in this city at present who antedate Dr. McMillan, of Halifax, in being admitted in 1860 to all the rights and privileges that the degree of B.A. confers,-viz., A. T. Drummond, LL.D., G. M. Macdonnell, K.C., and Rev. Donald Ross, D.D.
