

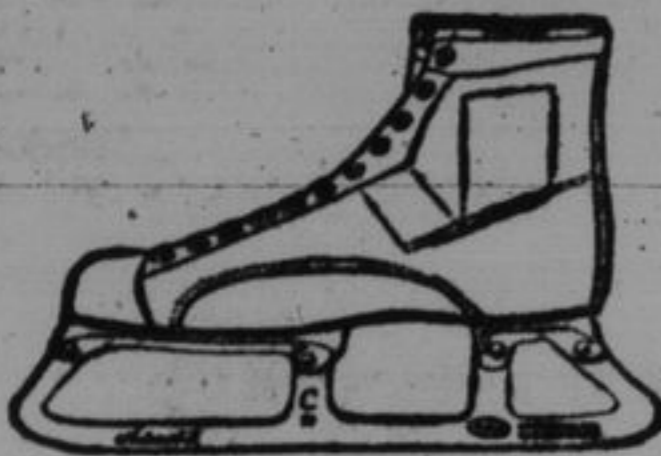

PRIZE FIGHTERS WHO FIGURED IN BRAWLS

John L. Sullivan, probably more than any other champion of the old days, figured in stories of private brawls. Most of these were pure fiction, but quite a few had their foundation in fact—all because of poor John L.'s fondness for the dram that cheered. They may cast aspersions at Sullivan's ring ability, but they cannot take from him the all-time championship of ring romance. It was only a few years ago, when the object of their admiration was removed, that east side boys stopped congregating about an old, twisted lamp post, which Sullivan was reputed to have broken with one blow. It was on Chrystie street, New York.

Corbett was another champion who figured in many a story of a private "go," but his name is not in the main, barroom scraps. Corbett liked to engage some well-to-do amateur and "kid" him into believing that he had championship ability. Corbett also was a champion at sarcasm. He indulged in a number of private debates which reached the fighting stage with Charley Mitchell and Bob Fitzsimmons. One of his brawls with Mitchell, we believe, ended in blows.

One of the barroom fights of the old days even got into the record books. It is set down that in 1884 Frank Slavin, the Sydney Cornstalk, was beaten in a barroom battle by Peter Jackson, the negro. Jackson and Slavin met in the ring in London in 1882 for the British heavyweight championship, and this time Jackson again was the victor, scoring a knock-out in the tenth round.

McGILL AND VARSITY TO COMPETE AT CARNIVAL

A Philadelphia despatch says: McGill and Toronto Universities have accepted the invitation to send teams to the University of Pennsylvania relay carnival, to be held at Franklin Field on April 29th and 30th.

The carnival promises to break all records so far as the number of contestants is concerned, university officials said. More than 3,000 athletes took part in last year's meet, and the large number of inquiries being received from universities, colleges and schools from all sections of the United States indicates that the entry list this year will be still greater.

Definite acceptance of the invitation sent to the combined universities of France have not yet been received.

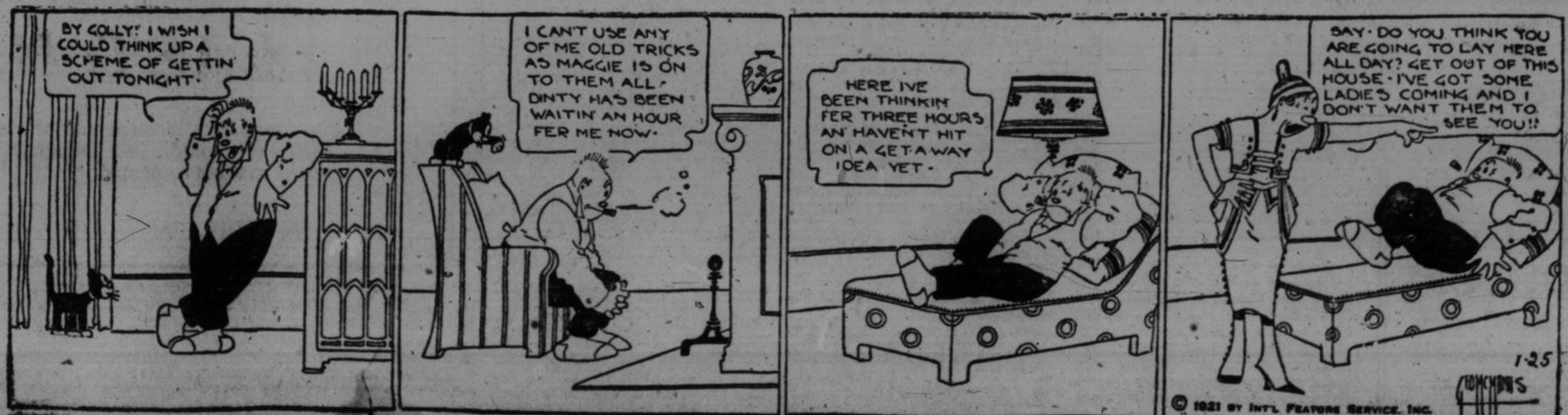
