DEMPESEY-CARPENTIER FIGHT IN NEW YORK

Some time back New York threatened to quarantine the Dempsey-Carpentier fight.

The promoters were given to understand they could not market a germ-carrier that threatened the life of the sport here.

The inference was backed with a vigorous punch aimed right at "the classic of the age," which the ring solons set a \$15 limit on prices.

Some wise one once said words to the effect that a pendulum swings so far and then back again.

This high-priced pendulum of Tex Rickard's seems now to have reached the swinging limit in the trouble direction and is heading back toward a less hostile level.

Since the fortune grabbing side of the affair is being scrapped by Rickard's intention to work the principals on a percentage basis, the animosity of New Yorkers is being moderated. Rickard has never mentioned the Dempsey-Carpentier bout to the boxing commission. Officially the solons have learned of the project only through the press.

However, it can be said authoritatively that the commission is not disinclined to approve of the bout.

The withdrawal of Brady and Cochran from partnership with Rickard is taken as the final verdict that the bout cannot be staged in London or Paris. Montreal remains, but Rickard would rather take his chance at home.

New York at this moment looks to be the battleground.

LOSE CANADIAN HENLEY UNLESS THEY SPEED UP

St. Catharines is getting uneasy again over the prospect of losing the Royal Canadian Henley Regatta and with the approach of spring the citizens are commencing to evince a lively interest in the matter.

The Royal Canadian Henley Regatta Association has laid plans for the moving of the clubhouse of the St. Catharines Rowing Club's quarters to the foot of Anne street in Port Dalhousie.

Various organizations throughout the city have promised a membership of 250, by which it is expected to raise \$2,500. The new local aquatic club will go in for rowing, canoeing, swimming and dinghy sailing.

Col. Arthur Bishop reports that the Navy League will co-operate with the new organization and it is confidently expected to get the assistance of the federal department of public works in improving the course.

"JACK" DEMPESEY LEAVES FOR TOUR OF EUROPE

Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, is to invade Europe.

With his manager, Jack Kearns he is to sail this week for London, where he will start an exhibition tour that will include England, France and probably other countries.

The champion can engage only in exhibition work, as the terms of his agreement with the promoters of the Dempsey-Carpentier bout prohibit him from engaging in a contest in Europe until he meets the Frenchman.

It will be the first trip of the heavyweight king to foreign countries and big financial returns are expected from Carpentier's strongholds which have had their only impression of the champion from moving pictures.
