GANANOQUE

Feb. 9. - Labor conditions in Gananoque, which it was conjectured, would probably improve at the beginning of the new year, have shown so far little if any advancement. Although prices have been lowered in a number of lines on foodstuffs and other staple articles of household needs, the work problem seems unimproved. There is a considerable number of unemployed bread winners. The local factories are doing the best they can, married men getting in almost every case the preference. Still with but three or four days work a week the problem of labor here is one which is very difficult of solution.

The funeral of Mrs. Peter Bishop, who passed away on Saturday last at the family residence, Stone street north, was held on Monday morning, at St. John's church where a solemn requiem mass was sung for the repose of her soul by Rev. Father Kehoe. The remains were placed in Gananoque vault.

The ladies of the congregation of St. John's church tendered a complimentary dance to those who assisted in connection with the
