Toronto, Feb. 11 .- Representing the live stock interests of Eastern Canada, a deputation headed by W F. Nickle, K.C., Kingston, waited upon the Drury cabinet to-day to draw the attention of the government to the high freight rates which, in view of falling prices and increasing costs, are seriously handicapping the live stock business. The prime minister gave the deputation a sympathetic hearing, and the cabinet will likely give supplication for a reduction of freight rates as applied to live stock.


