**To Go to Smith's Falls.**  
Lt.-Col. G. H. Gillespie returned from Smith's Falls on Wednesday evening, having completed the arrangements for a civic reception to the governor-general on Saturday next, when his excellency will present prizes to the high school cadet team won in the competitions for the Imperial Challenge shield. Brigadier General King, Lt.-Col. Gillespie and officers of the district headquarters staff will attend the reception at Smith's Falls on Saturday.

It appeared to be very much confused, and finally missed a jump at one of the subway fences and fell stunned. It was secured by some boys and the chief of police, and banded comfortably in a stable. Unfortunately it was found dead yesterday morning.

**Moving to the City.**  
The sale of stock on Lawrence E. Trotter's farm, Pittsburg, on Tuesday, realized good prices. Three cows brought \$80 each, four horses at

\$180 each and a yearling colt at \$75. The implements and machinery brought good prices, the Happy Farmer tractor selling for \$1,230. Mr. Trotter vacates the farm to Thomas Gillespie, Joyville, who bought it next week. He will take up residence in the city.

**Not Beneficial to Farmers.**  
The open winter has been a disadvantage to farmers in sections where there was a light snow-fall as they have had difficulty in getting their usual winter hauling done. The effect upon fall wheat, clover and timothy is not thought to be as bad as it might have been because the frosts have been very light. As a rule the weather of the past month is destructive to the meadows not protected by snow and some, especially land at the bottom of valleys, will no doubt be killed out. But no reports of extensive injury have come to hand thus far. In the western and central parts of the province winter wheat is reported to be generally in good condition.

Permits are only for a year and cost nothing. The act does not authorize any fee.


**Seven-Cent Car Fare.**
