When was the first pineapple grown in England? It has been stated that the ancestor of the ducal house of Portland introduced the culture from Holland in 1690, but Horace Walpole possessed a picture de-picting Charles II. in the act of receiving from Rose, the royal gardener (on bended knee), the first pineapple raised in England, and wrote a note on the back of the frame to that effect, adding, "This picture belonged to Mr. London, the VICTORY BONDS FOR SALE, MONEY DURSeryman (partner of Mr. Wise) whose heir bequeathed it to Rev.
