KEEPS TWO WIVES IN ONE APARTMENT

First Wife Consents to Stock Brokers' Strange Establishment.

Jersey City, N.J., April 15.—The strikingly strange case of a man who lived with two wives in the same apartment was revealed here yesterday. The man is Herbert Thornton Andrews, 30-year-old stock broker. The women are Mrs. Maud Augusta Haynes Andrews, 45, whom he married in Portland, Maine, June 17th, 1912, and by whom he has two boys, John, eight, and Harley, six—and Mrs. Esther Marie Tatal Andrews, 25, who went through a marriage ceremony with him in Greenwich, Conn., January 25th, 1921.

Mr. Andrews is head of the stock brokerage firm of H. T. Andrews and Company, with principal offices at 20 Broad street, New York, and branches in New London, Conn.; Philadelphia, Pittsburg, Chicago and Cleveland. The second "Mrs. Andrews" is reported to be a member of a reputable Pittsburg family.

The first "Mrs. Andrews" declared that the younger woman was brought to the brokers' home here on the day of the Greenwich ceremony and formerly introduced to her by Mr. Andrews as his "wife." She told friends that she continued to live in the same apartment, occupying an alcove bedroom, "for the sake of her boys," and because she felt confident that her husband would soon tire of the younger woman.

Friends of Mr. and Mrs. Andrews point out that there is nothing illegal in his action. No prosecution for bigamy may be brought in the state of Connecticut, they said, unless it be accompanied by evidence of the actual consummation of the marriage within the boundaries of the state. Mr. Andrews and Mrs. Esther Marie Andrews, they added, came here directly after the ceremony and have since lived in Mr. Andrews' home here.

Why Personal Cleanliness Is Safe Guard Against Typhus.

There is always more dread of a filth disease than of any other kind of ailment. It is revolting to think of the origin of such an attack. The victims suffer from the disease itself and also from the nastiness of it.

Typhus fever is one of this sort. Under the name of "jail fever" it has been dreaded for centuries. The infection is carried and spread by lice. Bad housing and filth are responsible for conditions which are favorable to its progress.

As typhus has its carriers, healthy persons may harbor the infection. Well persons may carry the disease to distant points and thus be responsible for cases in the most unexpected places. Wherever there are lice or conditions favorable for the transmission of lice there is danger of typhus.

The onset of the disease takes place from 10 to 20 days, usually about 12 days after infection. Headache is the most constant of the preliminary symptoms. In a well defined case there is a marked chill, or a succession of milder chills.

The headache, prostration, backache, legache, general feeling of illness and fever, drive the patient to bed. The fever grows worse, the face becomes red, the pulse rapid and the tongue furred. There are dullness and stupidity, or else wild delirium.

Later Symptoms

After three or four days a rash comes out on the abdominal and chest walls. Later the face, arms and legs may be covered. At first the red and mottled skin is only on the surface—pressure of the finger will cause it to bleach out. Later, pressure has no appreciable effect.

In children the rash is so much like measles it has often led to a wrong diagnosis.

As the disease progresses all the symptoms grow worse. After a week or ten days the delirium becomes more marked and the fever is greatly increased. The victim lies in a stupor. He may be unconscious even though his eyes are open.

In fatal cases the fever may rise to 109 degrees. In favorable cases the fever drops and suddenly there is an abrupt change for the better.

Fatal in Europe.

There is a mild form of typhus called "brill's disease." This is now considered identical with the real disease.

The fatalities from the disease differ with the locality and the general conditions of the population. It is very fatal in Europe. In the war it swept countries because of the lowered vitality of the people.

It is said that in Russia half the doctors have died from it, and in the Balkans there are not 5 doctors left alive.

During the past hundred years nearly 50 per cent of the doctors attending the typhus wards in Ireland have died of the disease.

The usual mortality varies from 10 to 50 per cent.

The sudden onset, chill, prostration, stupor, and particularly the blood change shown by what is called the "Felix-Widal" reaction, and later the peculiar eruption of the skin are the important diagnostic symptoms. The treatment is similar to that of typhoid fever.

Personal cleanliness is the way of safety. Typhus fever is transmitted in only one way—body lice.
